

Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

On this Third Sunday of Easter, Cycle C, the lectionary provides a marvelous resurrection appearance from John's Gospel account: John 21:1-19. There are two very rich sections to this selection. The passage you will hear or will have heard at the liturgy will be John 21:1-14. The latter portion, John 21:15-19, will not be proclaimed.

How can that be? Well, the lectionary allows the one preaching to choose a long form or short form of the Gospel prescribed. I have chosen to address the latter in my homily, for the latter portion is so powerful it can easily distract from the first. But let me address this unheard portion here in the bulletin.

Did you ever think about the English word "love?" I am sure you have. English has but one word for "love."

In the ancient Greek of the Bible, there are four different words for "love": *eros, storge, philia* and *agape.* "*eros*" is erotic love; "*storge*" is familiar love; "*philia*" is brotherly love or affectionate love, and "*agape*" is selfless love.

If we look at the text, and insert the Greek words for "love" and their proper meaning, a deep insight surfaces.

"When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter,
"Simon, son of John, do you love me — agape love — more than these?" He
said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you — phileo love—." He said to
him, "Feed my lambs." He said to him a second time, "Simon, son of John, do
you love me — agape love —?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I
love you — phileo love—." He said to him, "Tend my sheep." He said to him the
third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me — phileo love—?" Peter was
grieved because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me? — phileo love—
" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you —
phileo love—." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep". (John 21.15—17)
Jesus' first request is for "selfless love." Peter's three responses

Jesus' first request is for "selfless love." Peter's three responses reveal that he cannot reach the high mark sought! His responses are about affectionate love.

The passage reveals something more -- about Jesus. Once the Lord has sought the highest form of love from Peter, he realizes Peter is not ready.

Therefore, the Lord settles for what Peter can offer in return for the selfless love revealed in the cross.

Perhaps this might encourage us. We may not have attained selfless love, either. But what we can offer at this time the Lord accepts.

You might want to read the last two verses, John 21.18-19, not quoted above. Peter will one day attain "agape." May we as well.
