

Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



A Letter from Matthew Fallon

The days can seem long but the months fly by... I am happily anticipating my second year with you all here at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish.

It has been so enjoyable meeting the parishioners which I have thus far, and I am starting to meet more now that we are easing back into full social life again. The staff in the office and the school are terrific, too. They have made my transition so much easier with their welcome, support, helpfulness and professionalism.

It has been a pleasure working with the children in Sunday Religious Education, at the school, and in sacramental preparations. Previously, I have not worked at a parish with a school. I admit, I was uncertain what to expect. It was the general perception where I grew up, only the very "goody-two-shoes" kids and reform school-bound children who got kicked out of public school attended parochial schools (ha)! What a great group of kids. It is heartening to see our community that is here for them.

I don't want to leave out the adults, either. The people I have met at Scripture studies and in the RCIA process are thought-provoking, really enriching. It is easy to see their eagerness to build their faith and relationship with Christ. There was such a great corps of people who made our re-animated VBS a great experience, for the 26 children who took part in the week.

So thank you, everyone for making my first year as an OLL parishioner a good one for me.

I do have a request for next year...join with me in our religious education. We did not have many enrollees in the Sunday Religious Education program, in part due to COVID but I am hoping to increase interest in this process. We will re-start Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW). We will have both teens and adults participating in the RCIA.

For our newer disciples to learn about life in our Christian Community, I would like to have more volunteers to fill numerous roles. I know it is difficult to commit your time and talent for helping every week. But, it is possible to make a significant spiritual contribution in the lives of our newest disciples, on a part time basis. As we all know, this happens in our daily lives. To lead a CLOW session, once every 4 to 6 weeks or assist/lead an SRE meeting, you can make an important spiritual contribution. You can pray daily/weekly for these new disciples, too. Or share your faith at a Confirmation or RCIA gathering can make a most positive impact in their lives. Your self giving love will also help our parish community build the Kingdom of God. Our mature parishioners have wealth of knowledge, experience and insight. Your commitment can be occasionally without taxing your time schedule. Younger adults have energy and enthusiasm, which can inspire without feeling overwhelmed by an everyday or every week commitment. Let's talk about how we can all help to build the Kingdom of God. As we move through the summer, you will be hearing more details from me and look forward to our conversations.


