



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

Recently I read in the Office of Readings a powerful quote which led to reflections. The quote is:

Do not focus on measuring your reputation, but rather upon your conversion.

The mile markers we have for life are many and varied. The actual mile markers we see along highways, especially interstates, are a Roman invention. It allowed the Roman Republic, and later the Empire, to measure distances needed by armies to travel. It also made for marking the distance over which troops could press citizens or the conquered people into service. This is reflected in Jesus' saying "if a soldier presses you to go one mile (the legal limit), go two instead.

Markers for our life helpful means to not only lay down limits (e.g., years of service before retirement), but they also can mark off goals to attain over time.

We use markers to note the process of aging, as when "decades" are a mark of wisdom, seniority, physical changes, and limits to certain kinds of activity.

Being a Christian Catholic has another and more lasting set of markers for life: the conversion of our very self. Truly, psychology and anthropology lay out for us phases of personal development and moral development. But when wedded to Catholic Christianity, that is, the Gospel and its many guides for us (beatitudes, Sermon on the Mount, Sermon of the Plain, the commandments [10] and Jesus' commandments [love God, neighbor, self; love one another as I have loved you), and the measure of judgment we find in Matthew 25]) they become a consistent measure of the conversion of our hearts and life.

In what phase are you and I on our road of conversion of life, thought, moral tenacity, attitudes, Gospel values? How about we spend some time reflecting on this, note our markers past and present, and set others for our future?

What a good use of our time as we live toward the culmination of our life in Christ!



JOIN US FOR THE UPCOMING ADULT SCRIPTURE STUDY: EXPLORE THE BOOK OF PSALMS!




Our Adult Scripture study for this autumn will be an exploration of the Book of Psalms. This book is a unique collection of the song-prayers of Israel. To study Psalms is to study prayer, ultimately to enter into prayer. The study will challenge participants to reflect on their own prayer and life experiences. This study (the first of two) focuses on a selection of twenty-eight psalms divided into three categories:

- □ Psalms of Descriptive Praise
- □ Psalms of Trust or Confidence
- U Wisdom Psalms

"Psalms of descriptive praise, also known as hymns, praise God for his ongoing, regular care of the world and humanity" (from p. 8 of the commentary). Psalms of trust or confidence reinforce the belief that the God who made and loves us will protect us in difficult situations. Wisdom psalms are an acknowledgment of God's justice in the right ordering of human affairs.

We will continue to offer two sections for the study on Thursday mornings at 10:00 a.m., and in the evenings at 7:30 p.m., beginning September 29. Cost for the study books will be \$20. Register on the parish website to join the group.
