



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

The God of the Old Testament is angry, menacing, vengeful, judgmental, powerful. At least, that is what some folks have told me over the years. They then speak of Jesus, his gentleness, mercy, compassion. They do not see how Jesus could be associated with the God of the Old Testament.

While there are moments when God is portrayed with strikingly human characteristics of power, anger, judgment, punishment, overall this is not the consistent portrait found in first testament.

I could sight many passages of the "steadfast love" (*hesed*, in Hebrew) of God found therein. My favorite is Psalm 63:2-9. Here is the text.

O God, you are my God-- for you I long! For you my body yearns; for you my soul thirsts, Like a land parched, lifeless, and without water. So I look to you in the sanctuary to see your power and glory.

For your love is better than life; my lips offer you worship! I will bless you as long as I live; I will lift up my hands, calling on your name. My soul shall savor the rich banquet of praise, with joyous lips my mouth shall honor you!

When I think of you upon my bed, through the night watches I will recall That you indeed are my help, and in the shadow of your wings I shout for joy. My soul clings fast to you; your right hand upholds me.

The commentary found in the USCCB Revised New American Bible describes this psalm as follows: "This Psalm express[es] the intimate relationship between God and the worshiper. Separated from God, the psalmist longs for the divine life given in the Temple, which is based on a close relationship with God. The phrase 'For your love is better than life' [is unique]. [O]nly here in the Old Testament is anything prized above life - in this case God's love."

There is an intimacy to Psalm 63 that echoes much of how God is described by the authors of many of the Psalms, by the prophets, and the holy writers of the Wisdom literature of the Old Testament.

It is from this well of intimacy that Jesus must have drawn in his own prayer life so clearly expressed in the Gospels, especially Luke's account.

Perhaps his lead could be a source for our relationship with God, if it isn't already.

"Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you."

One of the main principles of living a <u>Stewardship</u> lifestyle is to give without expecting anything in return. This is difficult for some to comprehend in our "consumerist" culture that we live in. This is even difficult for many parish communities that have become heavily dependent on parish fundraising events to support the mission and ministry of their local parish. Generally speaking, at a parish fundraiser, you pay money and receive something in return, it's just a financial transaction. This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where you unite your sacrifice with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with Him.



Upcoming Adult Scripture Study

Our Adult Scripture study for this autumn will be an exploration of the **Book of Psalms**. This book is a unique collection of the songprayers of Israel. To study Psalms is to study prayer, ultimately to enter into prayer. Participants will be led to reflect on their own prayer and life experiences. This study (the first of two) focuses on a selection of twenty-eight psalms divided into three categories: **Psalms of descriptive praise**, also known as hymns, praise God for his ongoing, regular care of the world and humanity. **Psalms of trust or confidence** reinforce the belief that the God who made and loves us will protect us in difficult situations. **Wisdom psalms** are an acknowledgment of God's justice in the right ordering of human affairs. - Two sections of the study are offered: On Thursday mornings at 10 a.m., and in the evenings at 7:30 p.m., beginning September 29. Cost for the study books will be \$20 Register on the parish website to join the group.

SRE: Sunday Religious Education: News
