Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

The first holiday of the seasons is upon us! Thanksgiving, that wonderful feast here in the United States centered upon family, connected to our ancestors who shared food with their neighbor Native Americans.

How many Thanksgivings have you enjoyed in your life? I recall many of them.

3924 Millersville Drive, where we grew up as children. Enveloped in the aromas of pulled bread drying, oysters thawing, potatoes boiling, cranberry sauce "sluicing its way" out of the can, and of course, the turkey thawed with that tang of freshness soon to be stuffed and baked in the oven till golden brown and moist! By Thursday afternoon, having attended Mass in the morning and salivating while it all came together, we were each in our places at table to be thankful!

Chicago at Ann and Phil's (our oldest sister) is memorable. Sitting in the living room with the "men," while the women worked in the apartment kitchen, was a treat. Enjoying the first time to sit at the "adult table" is a very fond memory of Tuohy Avenue.

Later, we would travel to Hanover Park, Illinois, where Martha and Ken's (our second oldest sister) lived with their growing family. Wending our way up US 52 and 41, connecting with the tollway in the dark hours of Wednesday evening, hoping to arrive without incident (it took nearly 4 ½ hours to get there!) The feast was always good, of course. There were, as well, always outdoor activities, walks in the cold and more than not, snow upon the cars Friday or Saturday morning. Meanwhile, fires in the "real" fireplace greeted us each evening!

Eventually, Indy siblings and mother (when she moved back here) would gather at SS. Peter and Paul Cathedral rectory, where Mary and her husband Jim brought forth a most delicious repast! When I moved on to Terre Haute, John and Jeanette's house on Rowin Road became our Thanksgiving Home. A small house, to be sure, with a great deal of love!

When J & J passed the baton to their daughter, Crystala, it was off to Shelbyville with her husband, Jeremy and their 2 children, along with close friends over the years.

Since 2016, we Indy dwellers gather at the rectory here at Our Lady of Lourdes. The Chicago area group gets together in the late summer at Martha and Ken's "farmette" in Poplar Grove, Illinois (the weather up that far north in Illinois is most unpredictable). The Colorado group Fran and Garrett (the youngest sibling and her husband], host their grown children, spouses and friends, in Fort Collins.

No matter the site, there are always friends and strangers invited to join us. Family is more than blood; it is also our common bond as citizens, and once in awhile, people from other parts of the world who marvel at what we share.




Advent Morning of Reflection
