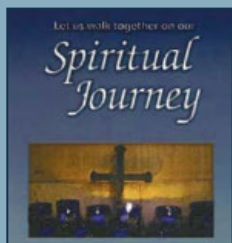

Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish:

For centuries, the Roman Catholic Church has celebrated Candlemas on February 2. The traditional practice of blessing candles and processions of candles takes place on this day.

Candlemas is known also as the Feast of the Presentation or the Purification of Mary, because it honors the day that Mary and Joseph presented the infant Jesus at the Temple. In bringing their child to the Temple and offering a sacrifice, Jesus' parents were following the Mosaic law (Leviticus 12:6) mentioned in the Gospel of Luke: "*And when the time came for their purification according to the Law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord.*" (Luke 2:22)

Why is Candlemas on February 2? Because February 2 is exactly 40 days (inclusive) after Christmas on December 25. The Mosaic law stated that 40 days was the period of purification after the birth of a child, and so the presentation took place 40 days after Jesus was born.

Incidentally, February 2 is also halfway between the winter solstice and the spring equinox, so the date has always had significance for ancient people.

Another custom in the United States annually occurs February 2 as well. Yes, you guessed it – Groundhog Day. Good old Punxsutawney Phil is drawn from his den to reveal, well, you know, how much longer winter will last.

Candlemas became linked to weather predictions about the end of winter because of an old English poem:

*If Candlemas be fair and bright,
Come winter, have another flight.
If Candlemas bring clouds and rain,
Go winter, and come not again.*

It makes sense that early February was a good time to prognosticate about the weather, especially as February 2 marks the midpoint between Winter and Spring. The English poem appears to be the source of the shadow connection: "fair and bright" = sun = shadows = more winter, while "clouds and rain" = no sun = no shadows = spring arriving soon.

It seems counterintuitive (why should a sunny day mean *more* winter?), but this is the exact pattern that Groundhog Day follows.

February 2: from the celebration of Phil to the ending celebration of the Incarnation of Christ. Silly predictive folklore vs. Divine intervention in history. Ironically, both lead us to prayer!
