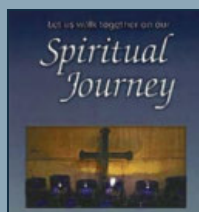

A Message from Amanda Bakemeyer

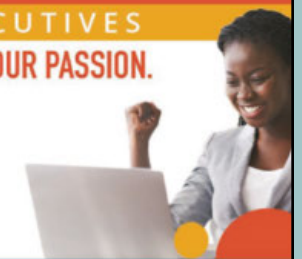
