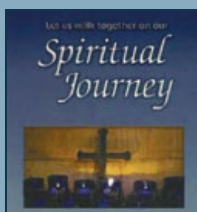
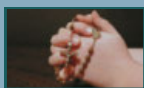

Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes parish,

Monday past was a gloriously beautiful Fall day. The tinge of cool air lay below the blue sky, the first odors of fallen leaves emerging -- the earth preparing for dormancy.

Monday afternoon we waited here on Washington Street. Waited for the passing of the funeral procession for K-9 officer Seara Burton. A traffic stop victim in Richmond, Indiana. Senseless and tragic.

The blue sky and cooler air waited. As processions are wont to be, this one, too, was slow to arrive. Folks were gathered across the street a good hour before the first police motorcycle arrived. They were a small group, with Joe Hammond (white shirt and tie, of course) at their center. They were there, not to gawk, but to honor.

I waited to emerge from the kitchen until the first chirp of the police presence pierced the reverie of dish detail. Moving from the mundane to the profound was easy, but not without emotional cost.

Traffic ceased to flow east to west. A trickle west to east was soon replaced by four lanes of relative silence. And then, blue, white, and red flashing lights, stretching from the east, arose from the horizon of Arlington Avenue.

They came, slowly and orderly. The periodic rumble of motorcycles was left behind to the relative silence of squad car after squad car, punctuated from time to time by an SUV or command car. A vanguard of Indiana and Ohio towns, cities, and counties -- each displaying, both large and small, "to serve and protect".

In the midst of it all, a somewhat grizzled homeless person joined me, viewing without knowing what was happening. I shared the events of that August afternoon when the tragedy unfolded. My companion shook his head, mumbling "I didn't know." He paused, and then opined, "It's not right." Again, a pause, and then, "Why don't people find a way to get along? Why can't they solve their differences without violence? People need to let go of their anger; it's killing people."

We remained silent then. The hearse passed. Family cars followed. Another hearse, empty. Then an ambulance, followed by a wrecker. A few more cars. Finally, a fire apparatus. Silence.

Too soon, traffic emerged both east and west. Washington Street returned to its swift and impersonal reality, a major thoroughfare alive again with movement far removed from a somber procession.

A wave to Joe and others across the way. A McDonald's card shared with my sidewalk companion, hungry and without a place to live. A return to the kitchen. Life, normal, settled upon me.

An hour later, Officer Burton's body returned to the earth from which it came. A final reminder that one fallen in the line of duty now is enfolded by the earth preparing for the glory of Fall and an Indiana winter.

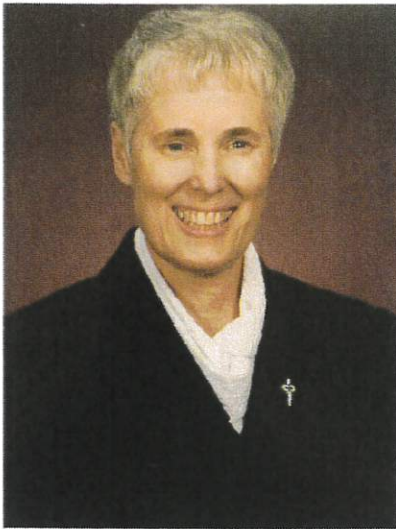

Our presenter for this gathering will be Sister Connie Kramer, SP.



Sister Connie was the tenth and youngest child born into her family. However, because her twin brothers were still born, and another brother died at age 7, she was raised in Dayton, Ohio, with five sisters and one brother. She graduated from Saint Mary-of-the-Woods College in 1964 entered the Sisters of Providence three months later, and has been a Sister of Providence for 56 years. She holds a Master of Science degree in Mathematics from Indiana State University, a Masters of Arts degree in Pastoral Ministry from Trinity College, and professional certification in Group Facilitation/Group Counseling as well as professional certification as a Grief Specialist and as a Spiritual Director.

Sister Connie spent ten years as a High School Teacher, Business Officer and Director of Development and thirty-five years in parish ministry as a Director of Religious Education, Pastoral Associate and Parish Life Coordinator. She currently lives with two other Sisters of Providence in Indianapolis, IN. Sister Connie has been a grief consultant for the Archdiocese of Indianapolis, currently offers a widow's retreat each year at Fatima, serves as the Coordinator of the Fatima Retreat House Step-Up Retreat Program which offers three retreats to men and three retreats to women each year who live in shelter housing and are in early recovery from addiction, and is a team member of the You Are Not Alone Ministry to survivors of suicide loss which is another sponsored ministry of Fatima Retreat House. Sister Connie is also the Spiritual Director for Seeds of Hope, which is a women's residential program for Alcohol and Drug Rehabilitation in Indianapolis, Indiana.
