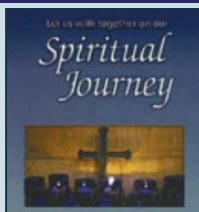

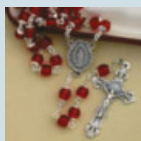

Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

We embark this week upon our annual "Festival of Prayer." It was Father Noah, working with the nascent Spiritual Journey Committee, who first molded this 8 days of communal prayer. Father Noah was many things; but first, through his Benedictine monastic heritage, he was a man of prayer who led many, many clergy, religious and laity to personal prayer and spiritual journey. He then called them to bring the gift of prayer to the community.

The thematic thread through this year's festival is "Peace." It is true that the Peace Candle of Bethlehem flickers constantly in our church, especially for peace in Ukraine. But the peace upon which we shall focus is the Peace of Christ "which is beyond all understanding" (Philippians 4:7).

Beyond understanding. What a strange way to urge the world, indeed Christians, to pursue "peace."

Actually, it is not ours to pursue, but receive. We are to allow it to permeate our dense hearts and minds. So permeated, we rest in that peace even in the midst of turmoil exterior and interior.

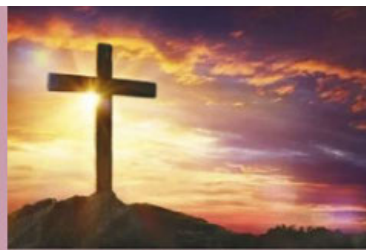
First, then, to receive it. St. Paul and St. Peter in their letters to Christian communities always began with a greeting of peace in Christ. Examine, if you will, the passages noted here (in the order they appear in the New Testament!)

Romans 1:7, 1 Corinthians 1:3, 16:11, 2 Corinthians 1:2, 13:11, Galatians 1:3, 6:16, Ephesians 1:2, 2:14ff, Philippians 1:2, 24:7ff, Colossians 1:2, 3:15, 1 Peter 1:2, 2 Peter 1:2

Note as well that such peace was a parting gift found on the lips of Jesus. "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (Jn 14:27) This passage is found in the Last Supper Discourse, in effect, Jesus' last will and testament to his beloved disciples.

Whether a greeting or a farewell, the question is: shall we receive the gift, embrace it, and then live with its constant healing presence?

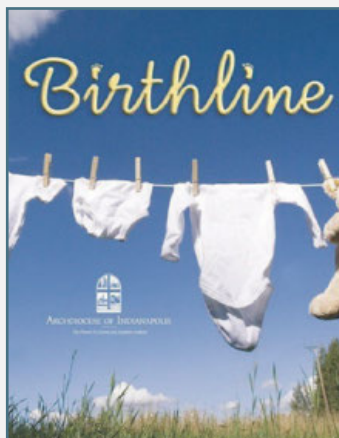

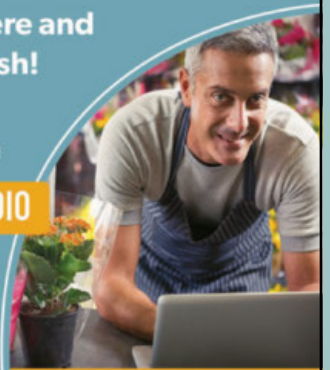

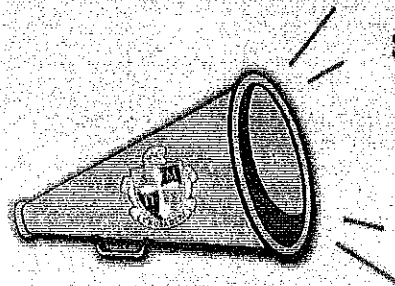
