Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

Our gathering song this weekend is not a traditional Lenten hymn. Yet, it is a proclamation of our dependence upon God – a part of our Lenten journey! "Lord of All Hopefulness" is a fine Irish (Gaelic) tune, "Slane." The four verses trace the day – morning, noon, evening, night.

The progression reminds me of the bells of a country church calling folks to wakefulness, noon meal, supper and sleep. For a monk or religious, it would elicit moments of prayer: morning, noon, evening, compline (night).

Savor the thoughts of each verse. Allow the Irish lilting melody to conjure how Jesus Christ is intimately with us all the day. Be thankful for his love and enduring faithfulness.

Lord of all hopefulness, Lord of all joy, Whose trust, ever childlike, no cares can destroy, Be there at our waking, and give us, we pray, Your bliss in our hearts, Lord, at the break of the day.

Lord of all eagerness, Lord of all faith, Whose strong hands were skilled at the plane and the lathe, Be there at our labors, and give us, we pray, Your strength in our hearts, Lord, at the noon of the day.

Lord of all kindliness, Lord of all grace, Your hands swift to welcome, you arms to embrace, Be there at our homing, and give us, we pray, Your love in our hearts, Lord, at the eve of the day.

Lord of all gentleness, Lord of all calm, Whose voice is contentment, whose presence is balm, Be there at our sleeping, and give us, we pray, Your peace in our hearts, Lord, at the end of the day.

If you have had students in school any time during the past three decades, you know the usual advice. Please help your students eat a good breakfast, be well rested, and be on time to school during testing. This is all great advice, but I also like to visit with the kids to reassure them that we know what they know, now let's show everyone else!

At Our Lady of Lourdes School, we also know that if teachers are passionate about the subject areas they are teaching, if they can put their own personalities and perspectives into their planning, then their energy abounds and children notice. When students feel that passion, they are inspired to learn. Then the testing scores will begin to take care of themselves.

Oversimplified, yes, but this is the foundation of how we "teach to the test." The teachers' work is often difficult and nuanced and must be adjusted, but when driven by their knowledge and enthusiasm for inspiring learning, each student will excel to his or her potential. As we move from IREAD-3 into ILEARN testing for grades 3-8 this April, we are excited to see the academic growth we witness each day reflected there.


