

Pastor's Corner

My dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

Our song during Preparation of the Gifts this weekend is the most popular, most sung hymn in the United States. Sung in both religious and secular settings, the melody (New Britain) brings the words to the fore. There is a driving element, both humble and triumphant, in this wedding of lyric and melody. I am writing, of course, of *Amazing Grace*.

What are the origins of these beloved lyrics? Various sources provide the following background.

"Amazing Grace" published in 1779. The words were written in 1772 by English Anglican clergyman and poet John Newton (1725–1807).

He was born in 1725 into a Christian home in London, England. His pious mother died when he was seven, and he joined his father at sea when he was eleven.

He led a licentious and tumultuous sailing life that included a flogging for attempted desertion from the Royal Navy and captivity by a slave trader in West Africa. After his escape, he himself became the captain of a slave ship.

Several factors contributed to Newton's conversion: a near-drowning in 1748, the piety of his friend Mary Catlett, (whom he married in 1750), and his reading of Thomas à Kempis' *Imitation of Christ*.

In 1754, he gave up the slave trade and, in association with William Wilberforce, eventually became an ardent abolitionist. Together, with many others, they brought about the end of the slave trade in the British Empire (Slave Trade Act, 1807) and Abolition of Slavery Act, British Empire, 1833).

Soon after he was ordained for ministry, he wrote this great hymnic text. Newton wrote, "I can see no reason why the Lord singled me out for mercy...unless it was to show, by one astonishing instance, that with him 'nothing is impossible'" (Newton, *The Life of John Newton*).

The original text (with the addition of an anonymous fifth verse) is below. It is an apt text for Lenten reflection.

> Amazing grace how sweet the sound That saved a wretch like me I once was lost, but now I'm found Was blind but now I see

'Twas grace that taught my heart to fear And grace my fears relieved How precious did that grace appear The hour I first believed

The Lord has promised good to me, His words my hope secure, He will my shield and portion be All long as life endures.

Through many dangers, toils, and snares, I have already come; This grace that brought me safe thus far And grace will lead me home



When we've been here ten thousand years Bright, shining as the sun We've no less days to sing God's praise Than when we first begun.


