

Pastor's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

The Raising of Lazarus (John 1:1-45) is this weekend's Gospel passage that echoes the first reading, Ezekiel 37:12-14. These come to us every three years in our Cycle A readings.

Appropriately, Greg Martin has chosen a wonderful hymn for Preparation of the Gifts. It is a stirring resurrection song, "We Shall Rise Again". Well does it connect to the Gospel passage, Martha's profession of faith in the resurrection on the last day, and Jesus' "I am the resurrection and life" announcement.

I first heard this hymn at the funeral of Father Jim Sweeney (d. February 25, 1990). As we processed in, the strains of organ and trumpet pulled us to the melody. Those same instruments providing a stirring bridge between the verses. And the melody, even though never heard before, leapt from our throats! It was one of those melodies where every note made sense, following one upon another, in a cascade of lyric and music wedded!

Those lyrics follow, rich with scriptural quotes and allusions. May this hymn provide us all with comfort and the whisper of Easter joy celebrated soon!

Come to me, all you weary, with your burdens and pain.
 Take my yoke on your shoulders and learn from me:
 I am gentle and humble, and your soul will find rest,
 For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.

Refrain:

We shall rise again on the last day with the faithful, rich and poor. Coming to the house of Lord Jesus, we will find an open door there, we will find an open door.

- 2. Though we walk through the darkness, evil we do not fear. You are walking beside us with your rod and your staff. Only goodness and kindness follow us all our lives. We shall dwell in the Lord's house for so many years to come! We shall rise again...
- 3. We depend on God's mercy, mercy which never fades. We remember our covenant and the promise Jesus made: If we die with Christ Jesus, we shall live with him, And if we are faithful, we shall reign with him! We shall rise again...
- 4. Do not fear death's dominion, look beyond earth and grave. See the brightness of Jesus shining out to light our way. Loving Father and Spirit, loving Jesus the Son, All God's people together, we shall live on as one! We shall rise again...
- 5. At the door there to greet us, martyrs, angels, and saints, And our fam'ly and loved ones, ev'ryone freed from their chains. We shall feel their acceptance, and the joy of new life. We shall join in the gathering, reunited in God's love! We shall rise again...

It seemed like there was much time to prepare for the big visit where a team of about 12 people and one archdiocese school assistant superintendent would spend the day learning about our school and assessing our vitality.

Last Wednesday came faster than anticipated. However, our teachers, students, parents, school commission, community members, and parish staff were prepared and ready. The visiting team arrived as the students were arriving. They entered Bernadette Hall and enjoyed a uniquely Irvington coffee/ tea bar prepared by our own Mr. David Jackson and his assistant Molly Pherson of Coal Yard Coffee. I presented a report, and then members of our parish staff and school commission visited to be

After a Jockamo Pizza lunch, fifth-graders, Linden Johnson and Lauren Dellinger led a school tour and answered questions. The team returned to Bernadette Hall to discuss and record their findings. I made several trips over to answer questions and clarify information. Our visitors, school principals and veteran teachers from around the archdiocese, were highly complimentary of our staff presence, the classroom climate, the student work on display, and our incomparable green swirls.

Soon I will be presented with a formal report from which we will create a new School Improvement Plan. The journey will continue with all of us here at Our Lady of Lourdes School collaborating to remain vital well into the future!
