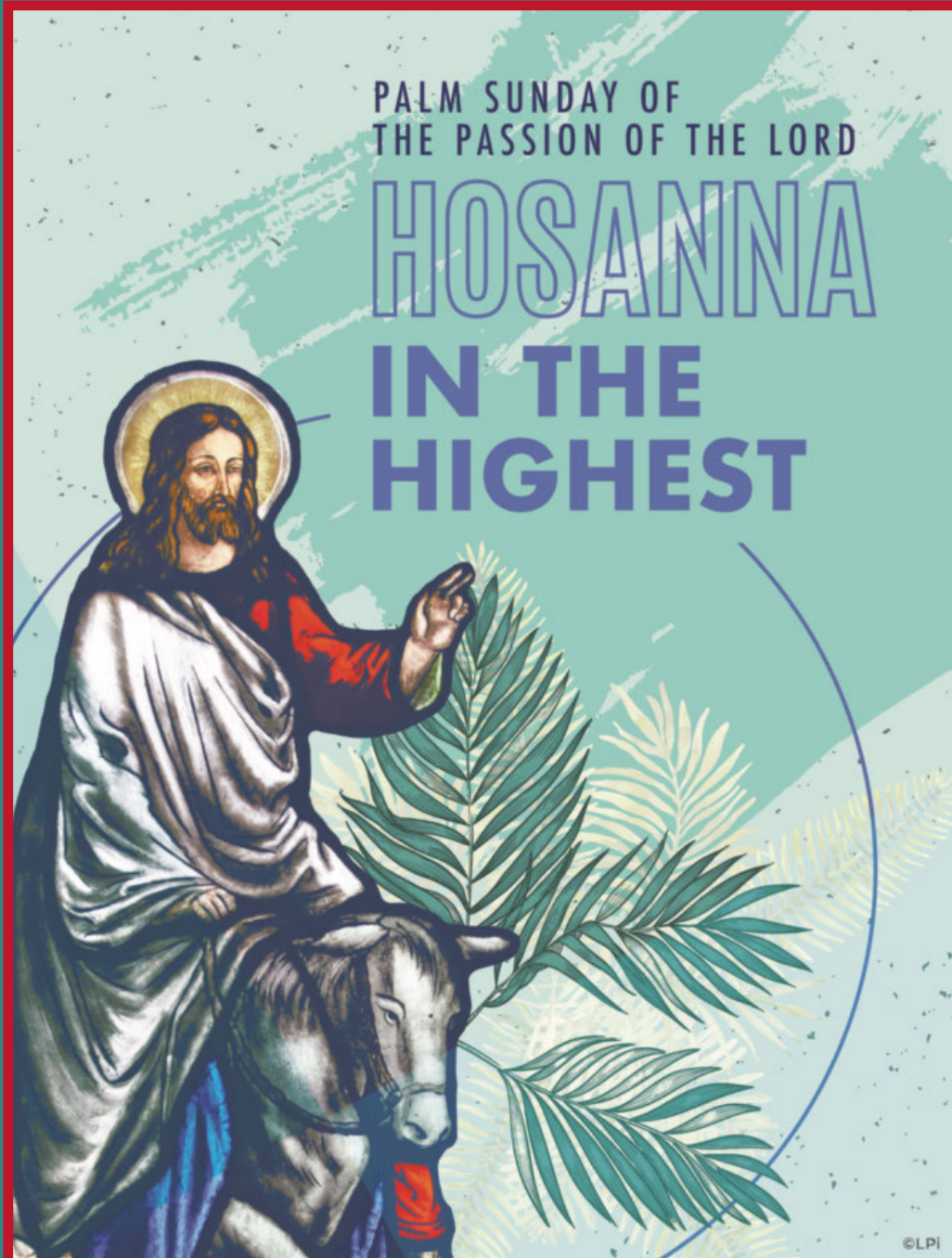

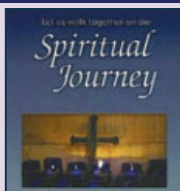

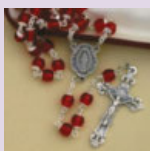

Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

As we embark upon Holy Week, we do so with palm branches in hand and voices raised in "Hosannah!"

In our local climate, it might seem more practical to use eucalyptus or pine branches. I am sure some developing regions of the world do use indigenous plants, for palms would be a costly imported luxury. But we hold palms.

This ancient Middle Eastern tradition allowed folks of little means to rejoice – for a military triumph, for the honoring of king or local leader, and for festive religious celebrations and processions to Temple.

In our culture we might use a flag, a banner hoisted high, or a cell phone light in a darkened arena to show our admiration or devotion.

But today, Palm Sunday, we are Judaeo-Christians connected to our ancestors by leafy symbol and vocal praise. We are sharing, as it were, in a "living memorial".

Many have walked the perimeter of churches this Lenten season following in the footsteps of the Lord's Passion; so we now stand in our pews acclaiming the Messiah who will walk, all too soon, the Via Dolorosa.

There are texts that follow from the Hebrew Testament that underpin this custom. Perhaps before (or after) you experience the proclamation of Matthew's account of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, a quiet reflection may root your experience more faithfully and fully.

You shall take the fruit of majestic trees,
branches of palm trees, boughs of leafy trees,
and willows of the brook;
and you shall rejoice before the Lord your God.

(Leviticus 23:40)

Your solemn processions are seen, O God,
the procession of my God, my King,
into the sanctuary –
the singers in front, the musicians last,
between them girls playing tambourines.

(Psalm 68:24-25)

Lift up, O gates, your lintels;
reach up, you ancient portals,
that the king of glory may come in.

(Psalm 24:9)

Cynthia holds master's degrees in Community Mental Health, and Marriage and Family Counseling. She has experience as a Crisis Specialist in Eskenazi's Crisis Intervention Unit, and in developing and providing services in conjunction with Community Court to reduce incarceration of sex workers, victims of sex trafficking, and substance use offences.

Cynthia has served with the Sandra Eskenazi Mental Health Mobil Crisis Assistance Team (MCAT) since its inception seven years ago. In partnership with an IMPD Officer, MCAT workers respond to 911 calls when mental illness appears to be a factor in an attempt de-escalate the situation. They are often able to facilitate admission to mental health services rather than arrest and incarceration.

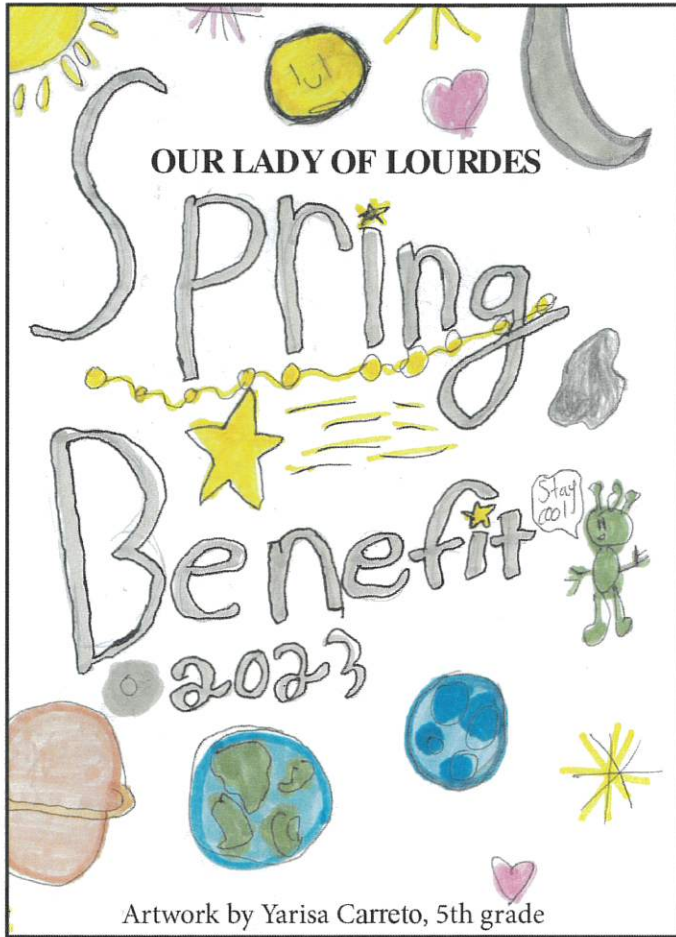
Cynthia is passionate about increasing awareness of mental illness and substance use disorders and decreasing misunderstanding and stigma. She has graciously agreed to share her knowledge and experience with us, and promises an interactive presentation that encourages questions from her audience.
