Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound. **Anointing of the Sick:** If you are



Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

perhaps he has not entirely understood it himself. perhaps he adulterates it. but he believes, and despite his fears he knows that he must communicate God's word to you.

for must not some one of us say something about God, about eternal life, about the majesty of grace in our sanctified being; must not some one of us speak of sin, the judgment and mercy of God?

so my dear friends, pray for him, carry him so that he might be able to sustain others by bringing to them the mystery of God's love revealed in Christ Jesus.

SCHOOL NEWS


