

Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



# Pastor's Corner

My dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

It should not be too surprising that the movie "Oppenheimer" debuted close to August 6. It was on this day in 1945 that the atomic bomb was first used as a weapon on the city of Hiroshima. Through it, our world was transformed - horrifically.

As I grew up, having been born 5 years and 19 days after that moment in history, I, my parents, grandparents and the youth of my generation were overshadowed daily by the threat of nuclear holocaust. We were formed in fear, dreading the moment when such weapons might be used again upon us. (We really were not thinking of the "other / enemy" who likewise lived with such threat. That would come later to our minds and hearts.)

Duck and cover. Turn away from the brighter than sun burst of light at the initial detonation. Do you know where the nearest bomb shelter is? (At Saint Andrew Parish we did: the basement of the yet unfinished church!) Look for the telltale yellow and black sign.

78 years later we continue to live with this fear, though it does not flood our thoughts as frequently as in the Cold War years. But the threat is still there for all of humanity.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration. It is once again August 6. This day recalls three companions of Jesus witnessing a bright light enveloping the person of their rabbi, Jesus. They see in the wash of that whiteness Moses and Elijah, two ancestors in faith of the greatest significance: one who spoke with God face to face (Exodus), the other taken up to heaven in a fiery chariot (II Kings).

Jesus, standing and conversing with these ancestors, is revealed in this burst of light as God in our midst. He is no longer just rabbi. He is "transfigured" to reveal the light of God, the life of faith, the covenant love that breaches the bonds of death.

Thus, beyond our being "transformed" in fear of holocaust, we are invited to be transformed by this revelation into people of hope, a hope that overcomes such fear and promises to lead us through this life into the next.

The psalmist writes: "In you is the source of life, and in your light we see light." May that be so for us this day, and always.



# CATECHISTS NEEDED AS WELL!

#### Welcome Father Giltus Mathias, CP

Congregation of the Passion, founded by St. Paul of the Cross in the early 1700s in Italy, had its beginning in Papua New Guniea (PNG), an incredibly primitive and demanding destination, in 1954 with the arrival of four young, inexperienced Passionists Religious from Australia, totally unaware that they will create a living and lasting legacy in the lives of people and church of PNG.

PNG occupies the eastern part of the world's third-largest island country and is prey to volcanic activity, earthquakes and tidal waves, not to neglect the existential issues such as violence, drug, illiteracy, and corruption that deny basic human dignity. Linguistically, it is the world's most diverse country, with more than 850 native tongues. Some 80% of Papua New Guinea's people live in rural areas with few or no facilities of modern life. Many tribes in the isolated mountainous interior have little contact with one another, let alone with the outside world, and live within a non-monetized economy dependent on subsistence agriculture.

The Passionists currently operate in two locations in PNG, first in Boroko, Port Moresby, where St Gabriel's Community for students in formation to religious life and priesthood and St.Joseph's church, the largest parish in the country, are located. The Passionists also have a presence in Vanimo in the northwest of PNG, not far from where the initial Passionist PNG missions began, where now Fr Valensius CP is the current Vicar General of the Vanimo diocese and keeps a watchful eye over the 'Senta Bilong Helpim', a centre for disabled children, along with Sr. Rowena CP. Fr. Giltus Mathias CP, a Passionist priest originally from India, now a missionary and member of the Passionist of the Holy Spirit Province Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea and Vietnam, will speak to us during the weekend of August 12/13.
