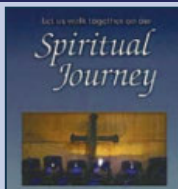

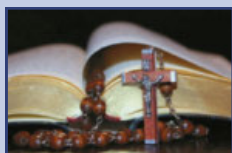

Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

By the time you read this, one-half of September will have passed. The Fall Festival will be upon us, ushering in the next season! Tempus fugit! (Latin for "time flies").

I had a delightful time with my family in Severance and Denver, Colorado, last weekend. It was a time of anticipation, joy, and promise. It was also a time of "shepherding" – folks 96, 78 and 76 – to airport, through security, to gate, etc. Then off in Las Vegas for a brief layover, repeat the process, land in Denver, and then secure the rental vehicle! My, four adults can move rather slowly! But we laughed, endured, and arrived safely. And then on Monday, repeat – but backwards!

I guess September is a month for text scammers. There is someone using a text number beginning with prefix (213) impersonating me to get folks to buy gift cards, with a promise of reimbursement. The texts are signed "Rev. Rick Ginther." **Please do NOT fall for this.** I would never send out such a request through text or email!

October 1, is a Sunday this year. As we have in past years, we will be offered the opportunity to stand on the sidewalks of Meridian Street to pray for human life, its sacredness and our call to preserve it from conception to natural death. Information that is more complete will follow as soon as it is available.

Please keep in prayer all those who are preparing to celebrate this year one or more sacraments! A number of our children are preparing for First Reconciliation (November 11, 10 a.m.) and then First Holy Eucharist (May 11, 5 p.m. Mass). Our 8th grades are preparing for Confirmation (Thursday, April 25, 7 p.m., Ss. Peter and Paul Cathedral). And at present we have 7 enrolled in the RCIA, some preparing for Baptism/Confirmation/Eucharist, some preparing for a Profession of Faith/Confirmation/Eucharist.

Finally, this coming Thursday/Friday/Saturday is our annual Fall Festival! Please, please, sign up to volunteer for at least a 2 hour shift. You will be assigned where most needed and I promise, you will enjoy this time of service to our parish. Then stick around for just an enjoyable time – games, silent auction, quilt raffle, great food, live music, and more!

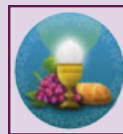

SCHOOL NEWS

We have some “OG”s in the hallways at Our Lady of Lourdes School, “tutors,” that is.

One of the best resources for working with children who are learning how to read is the Orton - Gillingham – or “OG” – approach. This method is described by the Orton-Gillingham Academy as a “direct, explicit, multisensory, structured, sequential, diagnostic, and prescriptive” method for helping those for whom literacy learning does not come easily.

Several of our teachers are trained and certified through Marian University as OG teachers and tutors. In more recent years, OG methods have been created for math instruction. Mrs. Christine Maciotok, Ms. Monica Asher, and Miss Julie Sprauer are all OLL teachers who are certified in the OG approach and have tutored our students during summer and after school hours. Mr. Chris Black is certified as a math OG tutor and will soon begin to apply these skills to help students better succeed.

These teachers are just a few of our staff who all value continued learning for the purpose of helping our students reach their full potential. Thanks in part to these true OGs we continue to move forward toward the vision for our school.

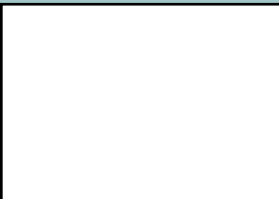

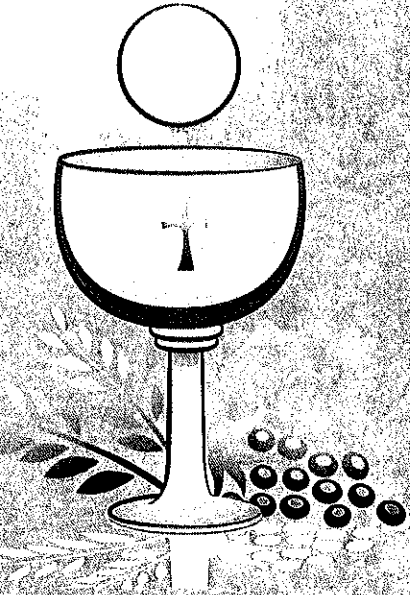
