

Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

Last Saturday, October 7, would have been my mother's 107th birthday. It was also the Feast of Our Lady of Rosary. The two concurrent celebrations have always allowed me to remember my mother's role in forming my faith, and the Mother of God's role in the mystery of faith!

While praying the Office of Readings and Morning Prayer that day, I noted that the concluding Collect for each (as well as the Collect for the Feast), was a most familiar prayer.

Pour forth, we beseech you, O Lord, your grace into our hearts, that we, to whom the Incarnation of Christ your Son was made known by the message of an Angel, may, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, by his Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of his Resurrection.

Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

– Amen.

In recent months, with the restoration of the tower bells, the Angelus bells have rung at the noon hour and 6 p.m. The hour is not struck, as at the other hours. Rather, the Angelus is a call to prayer.

In centuries past, this daily invitation peeled out a call to workers, especially in the fields, to pause and pray. It also called them to rest and eat, after their prayer.

The prayer which they said (and which we pray here at OLL before the commencement of the 6 p.m. Masses on Tuesday and Thursday) has a biblically based format. It flows from the Gospel of Luke and the Gospel of John. Here it is in its entirety.

V. The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary. R. And she conceived of the Holy Spirit. *Luke*

Hail Mary, full of grace, The Lord is with Thee; Blessed art thou among women, And blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, Pray for us sinners, Now and at the hour of our death. Amen

V. Behold the handmaid of the Lord. R. Be it done to me according to thy word. *Luke*

Hail Mary. . .

V. And the Word was made flesh. R. And dwelt among us. *John*

Hail Mary. . .

V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.

R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

V. Let us pray.

R. Pour forth... (as above)

In this month of the Rosary, it is good to pray this prayer that our ancestors relied upon to remind them daily of God's goodness and love and of the role of the Spirit and Mary in our salvation.

Confirmation Retreat Coming Up


Our Confirmation candidates will be going on retreat November 4-5. Please pray for them to have an enriching experience.


