

Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

This Wednesday we begin our annual Lenten "desert contest." Our "alleluia's" will be silenced. Our appetites curbed. Our thoughts moved toward a fuller realization of our sinful longing for repentance, healing, and renewed spiritual vigor. As we commence, let's consider the following passage I found in my Lent resources.

"What the Christian warfare means is giving up sin and building up ways of virtue in place of sin. This is not done without effort and real struggle. Actually, for each person it means mobilizing energies and facing the enemy right at the front lines and battling there.

"While the precise character of the battle varies with the individual person, the weapons which the church provides are the same for all. And each person will find that these weapons meet precisely her or his individual needs in the battle. These weapons are prayer, fasting and almsgiving." Jane Marie Murray, OP, from "Going to God, Book One: The Christian Life," 1957, Fides Publishers Association, Chicago.

I was born in 1950, on the very day that the Korean conflict became a declared war. In my lifetime (73 ½ years) I have seen actual wars and warfare every year. My dislike for the words "war" or "warfare" is nearly visceral; it wells up as a silent scream.

And yet, beyond my personal negative reaction, Lent is an apt time for "spiritual warfare."

Saint Paul in Romans, Chapter 7, describes his back-and-forth battle with his desires and his failures in not doing what is right and doing instead what is wrong. I can relate to such a description! There is conflict between my physical and emotional desires and my spiritual longings.

Our culture does not encourage us to bridle our appetites and desires. We are not encouraged to pursue virtue. We are not encouraged to be the "master / mistress" of our urgings. Because it involves suffering, change, and a sometimes-radical departure from "cultural norms."

When I have read about decisive battles that "turned the tide," each of them took planning, and analysis of strengths and weaknesses, opportunities and threats. The plan always produced alternatives established for various situations, pivots to one of the alternatives, discipline and training, and an internal willingness to say "no" to foolish choices.

If we apply this to our Lenten practices to combat our outsized desires and habits, then we can arrive at our own "battle plan," that will result in a spiritual outcome – an outcome resulting in a balance of personal discipline and spiritual renewal.

We have time to begin the plans for our "battle" with our physical appetites, outsized desires, and sinful habits. By God's grace, may we endure through the season of Lent to the new life of Easter.

SCHOOL NEWS

During this time of the school year, many teachers assign projects that reinforce what the students have been learning. One such project in eighth grade social studies class was the mock trial of Andrew Jackson.

The students were very well prepared and took on all of the roles one would expect to see in a courtroom. They dressed the parts of prosecuting and defense attorneys, a bailiff, witnesses, defendant, a jury, and an audience. In a surprise move, the defense decided that Jackson should not testify. Attorneys debated arguments related to the federal banking system, Native American rights, and the right to protest.

The most creative argument came from the defense. They presented an ingenious argument for a mistrial. Their reasoning was that there were distracting interruptions of the court proceedings from loud clanging of the boiler heating system. The judge ruled against them, preventing their attempt to rewrite history.
