Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

As we commence our Season of Lent, we all take note of our need for conversion of life. It is a part of our annual Christian/Catholic Lenten journey.

This year, we have 5 folks who are working on some "conversion of life" through the RCIA. Lent is a powerful focal season for them. Additionally, the season provides their witness to us of their journey through a series of "Rites." Let's look at each of these ritual moments.

This Sunday, the Catechumens and Candidates stand before us for the Rite of Sending. This rite sends the non-baptized Catechumens to the Rite of Election. This rite also sends the already baptized Christians who are seeking to enter the Roman Catholic Church to the Call to Continuing Conversion. Our sending of them to Ss. Peter and Paul Cathedral, is a statement of their intention to complete their journey into the Church. It is also our opportunity to pray over them.

At the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion, the Church in the person of the bishop (or his delegate) recognizes them and proclaims them "elect" or "candidates," depending on their baptismal status. It is truly a stirring liturgy of the word and ceremony!

On the Second Sunday of Lent (February 25), the candidates are called before us for the Penitential Rite. In this rite, the community prays for the candidates (already baptized) for the strength needed to continue their journey toward the Easter Sacraments (confirmation and eucharist). We pray that whatever sin is in their lives may be overcome and ask the Spirit to be poured upon them.

On the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent, the "elect" (non-baptized) enjoy the "Scrutinies." These rites are a support to their self-searching and repentance (thus the name "scrutinies"). The rites above all have a spiritual purpose.

As the Rite of Christian Initiation states, the scrutinies "... are meant to uncover, then heal all this is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all this is upright, strong, and good. For the scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ."

And of course, each week of Lent, as before in Ordinary Time, the elect and candidates are sent forth after these rites to continue to ponder the Word of God that has been shared during the Liturgy of the Word.

It is ours, as the faithful of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, to prayerfully support these individuals on their journey of faith.




