

Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

To scrutinize. As the dictionary notes, "scrutinize" means "examine or inspect closely and thoroughly."

This Sunday, we begin a series of three "scrutinies." These RCIA rituals offer the Elect (non-baptized seeking the Easter Sacraments) our prayerful encouragement and a defense against sin as they make their final preparations for the Easter Vigil. We are praying that they will be able to thoroughly examine the sin that has been a part of their lives and ask the Lord in Baptism to remove those sins through the life-giving waters.

We all have opportunities to "scrutinize" our lives. We call it an "examination of conscience." This examination (or scrutiny) asks us to acknowledge the goodness of God in our lives, to reflect upon how we have lived the gospel, and to assess where we have failed, either by sinful action or inaction.

Too often we look at this examination as merely rooting out our sin. For two reasons, I believe that is out of balance.

First, it is an overemphasis on the negative. Second, it emphasizes God's power for forgiveness, but leaves out God's power in the Spirit to motivate us in right living.

St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) crafted a balanced, daily / twice daily "examen." We would all do well to find a version of this spiritual practice and implement it in our daily lives.

We are all a mixture of goodness and sinfulness. It is important to acknowledge this fuller sense of who we are. We will all be more uplifted and cleansed. And more prepared to celebrate Easter joy along with those for whom we pray these next three Sundays.


