

Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

A FEW WORDS REGARDING INTERCESSORY PRAYERS FOR THE SICK

It is one of the works of mercy to pray for the sick. At Our Lady of Lourdes, this practice goes back more than 50 years. The methods used to do this have varied over the years. Thus, it should not come as a total surprise that a change in method could be considered and approved.

The Liturgy Committee of our Spirituality and Worship Commission spent a number of meetings discussing how best for us to pray for the sick at our weekend and holyday Masses. The discussion concluded with a new policy for Mass, bulletin, etc. That new policy is as follows.

- 1. The name of one who is sick, when submitted, will be read in church for two weeks, following the request. After that, the name will appear in bulletin until the person who made the request informs the parish secretary that the person has recovered.
- 2. However, if the person in the bulletin list worsens, their name will be returned to the in church list for another two weeks.
 - a. The process of moving the name to the bulletin will be followed subsequently.
- 3. Signing up a sick person for prayer should be done in one of two ways.
 - a. Contact the parish secretary to make the request. A record of the request will be made and kept by the parish secretary. The name and contact information, of the one requesting prayer will be recorded so that any follow-up can be done efficiently.
 - b. If a person makes a request before Mass in the sacristy, the one requesting will be asked to fill out a blue form with the same information that they would be asked if communicating with the parish secretary (3.a.) This sheet will be transferred to the parish secretary, so that follow-up may be done as needed.
- 4. This policy will be reviewed, by the Liturgy Committee, on an annual basis at the May meeting.

One of the methods used in the past was a *book on a stand* near one of the doors of the church into which requests for prayer could be added. In considering this, the Liturgy Committee felt that the flow of those entering or leaving the church would be seriously hampered due to the small size of our entries/exits.




