

Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

Today is "Good Shepherd Sunday." It is so named because each year on the 4th Sunday of Easter, we hear from John's Gospel account, Chapter 10. It contains the "discourse" on the Good Shepherd.

Today is, as well, World Day of Prayer for Vocations. It, too, comes around each year on the 4th Sunday of Easter.

While there are many life vocations – indeed life vocations within the Church – there are two that are Sacrament: Marriage and Orders.

From the Sacrament of Marriage comes those who will serve the Church in so many ways: men and women religious, consecrated virgins, singles, catechists, teachers, administrators, maintenance workers, music directors, business managers, communications directors, secretaries, volunteers, and many more.

From the Sacrament of Orders comes those who enter the order of permanent deacons, transitional deacons, priests, and bishops.

While all "vocations" in the Church are of great value, let's concentrate on the ordained this week in our prayer! Let us pray for vocations to the diaconate and priesthood. We need these folk who dedicate their lives to the sacramental life of us all! And yes, we currently need more priests to bring us to the Table of Word and Eucharist!

As we prepare for the first National Eucharistic Congress since 1941, please keep praying for those deacons, priests and bishops who bring the gift of God's sacramental grace to us!

And let us realize that all deacons, priests, and bishops need the sacramental care of other deacons, priests, and bishops!


