

Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



Pastor's Corner

My dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

We live in a distracted and distracting world. This is nothing new in the course of time. However, we are more bombarded by the knowledge of things over which we have no control, and the baubles and glitter of too much.

As I said, the reality is nothing new. Pope Gregory the Great (540-604) wrote of such. He framed it in a sermon. The outset of the sermon was on the Good Shepherd. He wanted his people to recall the goodness of this shepherd, especially how he would guide people through this life to the eternal banquet, that is, the Heavenly Eucharist.

Here are the words of wisdom that he shared. I have *inserted* some comments to bring this 6th century text to the fore.

"Beloved brothers [and sisters], let us set out for these pastures where we shall keep joyful festival with so many of our fellow citizens. May the thought of their happiness urge us on! Let us stir up our hearts, rekindle our faith, and long eagerly for what heaven has in store for us. To love thus is to be already on our way.

"No matter what obstacles we encounter, we must not allow them to turn us aside from the joy of that heavenly feast.

"Anyone who is determined to reach his destination is not deterred by the roughness of the road that leads to it [threats, dangers, obstacles]. Nor must we allow the charm of success to seduce us, or we shall be like a foolish traveler who is so distracted by the pleasant meadows through which he is passing that he forgets where he is going."

Good, nourishing food for thought as we continue our journey through the Easter Season.

SCHOOL NEWS

Not everyone who works at Our Lady of Lourdes School is also a member of the parish, but I am among those who are. When I attend Mass on the weekends, I enjoy seeing our students in the pews with their families. Lately, I've noticed an uptick in the number of our students attending Masses on the weekends. This is obviously a positive trend, but for reasons some may not immediately realize.

Some of our youngest students struggle to stay focused and participate during our school Masses. On the weekends, they are receiving the same guidance toward how to participate with responses, prayer, and singing that they hear from teachers during the week. They see other whole families and unfamiliar adults modeling the positive behaviors that their teachers expect.

Older students often take the initiative to participate in various roles during the weekend Masses. Some lead Children's Liturgy, are altar servers, carry up the offertory gifts, usher, and even help train younger students in some of those roles.

Perhaps the best result – other than the individual student's growth in faith – that comes from seeing more school kids at Mass is noticing how happy it makes Father Rick! See you next week!


