**Communion Calls:** Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



## Pastor's Corner

My dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish:

On the morning of June 19, 1865, Union Major General Gordon Granger arrived on the island of Galveston to take command of the more than 2,000 federal troops recently landed. They were there to enforce the emancipation of Texas' enslaved population and oversee Reconstruction.

On that morning, a proclamation was posted in all public places in Galveston. The proclamation, a culmination of the Emancipation Proclamation and the passing of the 13<sup>th</sup> Amendment, read:

"The people of Texas are informed that, in accordance with a proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free. This involves an absolute equality of personal rights and rights of property between former masters and slaves, and the connection heretofore existing between them becomes that between employer and hired labor. The freedmen are advised to remain quietly at their present homes and work for wages. They are informed that they will not be allowed to collect at military posts and that they will not be supported in idleness either there or elsewhere."

A celebration by the former slaves followed. It was joy filled! Over the next decades, the celebration spread through former Texas slaves to the other southern states, and eventually, from the southern states north.

The celebration came to be known as Juneteenth. In 2021 it was declared a National Holiday. Like the Fourth of July, Juneteenth is always celebrated on June 19.

This Wednesday many folks will join to recall this event. Their celebrations will be festive gatherings of food and friendship and rejoicing. In one sense, their time together could be seen as a reflection of the Passover Meal when Jews celebrate their ancestors' release from slavery through God's miraculous actions.

In Christ, we have all been released from slavery to sin and death. May that release be a spiritual gift shared indiscriminately.

Thus, it would be a good thing for each of us to pause and pray this Wednesday for all those released from slavery.

Let this prayer lead us to ask God to continue to release our country from intolerance, bigotry, and any form of racial or national supremacy.

May this prayer then lead us further -- to ask for the release of those trapped in despair, especially those who are victims of human trafficking.


