

Pastor's Corner

My dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

Last weekend's attempted assassination of former president Donald Trump roiled the nation, indeed, the world. Personally, it left me hollowed out.

I have lived through such failed and tragic attempts it seems throughout my life.

The first scar on my psyche was Medgar Evers (summer, 1963). Next came President Kennedy that same year (8th grade).

Dr. Martin Luther King was felled the opening day of senior retreat, followed too quickly by Bobby Kennedy (while on senior trip).

George Wallace was shot and paralyzed 4 days before graduation from St. Meinrad College.

And who can forget that March day in 1981 when President Ronald Reagan nearly died, and 6 weeks later Pope John Paul II entered this long list of attempts (just as I was completing my first year at Mt. St. Mary's Seminary).

More have sprinkled the calendar: Harvey Milk and Mayor George Moscone (1978), Gabrielle Giffords (2011), Steve Scalise (2017). And now, Donald Trump.

An article from America Magazine (on-line) offered a chilling review of this history, and explored the questions of violence in our country's history, gun control or lack of it, care for the mentally ill, etc. It lamented the oft heard statements which follow political violence ("This is not who we are") and mass shootings ("Our thoughts and prayers are with them") that, holding some truth, are so quickly whisked away by the next news cycle.

I believe, as the author of this article suggests, that the words "this is not who we are" be uttered not as a statement of fact but as a mantra, a prayer for who we hope to be.

For hope to be realized, a conversion to facing the moral issues by us all is needed. Our faith calls us to hard conversations, with an open ear, heart and mind to our common fears, longings, and possible solutions.



Visiting Priest on July 27 & 28

On the weekend of July 27/28, Fr. Douglas Grandon, from Mary Mother of God Mission Society and the Vladivostok Mission will visit our parish to speak about the Roman Catholic Mission Churches in Eastern Russia. Please look at the ends of each pew for a donation envelope to help support the work of the Mission.

In the early 1900's, the Russian Far East boasted a thriving Roman Catholic population. Many Russians, Poles, Lithuanians, and other groups inhabited the area and had built schools, hospitals, and beautiful churches. After the revolution of 1917, Russia became an emblem of the Communist era, a land without churches and without God. Under Stalin, all Catholic churches were confiscated and Dioceses closed. Most churches were desecrated or destroyed. Catholics were murdered by the hundreds of thousands and their bodies dumped into mass graves.

Our two American priests, Fr. Myron Effing, CJD, and Fr. Daniel Maurer, CJD, arrived in Vladivostok in 1992 to help re-establish the Church in this region and provide charitable assistance to the many poor. Now that the foundations have been laid, additional priests and sisters are joining the work, and parishes are growing and multiplying, very slowly, but surely.
