**Communion Calls:** Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



## Pastor's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

The first fifteen days of August bring reminders of our faith and human history. Among them are:

August 6 – Feast of the Transfiguration, and 79th anniversary of Hiroshima.

August 9 - Memorial of St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, Martyr, and 79th anniversary of Nagasaki

August 10 - Memorial of St. Lawrence, Deacon and Martyr, patron of those who work with open fires (cooks, bakers, brewers, textile cleaners, tanners) those to whom fire means harm (librarians, archivists, miners, poor people), and comedians

August 14 - Memorial of St. Maximillian Kolbe, Priest and Martyr

August 15 - Feast of the Assumption. Declared the 4th Marian Dogma, 1 November 1950.

It is easy to allow these reminders to quickly pass. Let's not do so this year. No, let's recall:

- God's gracious love for humanity in his Son, transfigured on Mt. Tabor with a glory pointing to resurrection and our redemption.
- Mary's role in our salvation as Mother of God, first disciple and first to share in the fruit of resurrection.
- Those who died for their faith in persecutions of the third and twentieth centuries
  - · Lawrence, who was roasted on a gridiron
  - Teresa, a Catholic Carmelite born a Jew, who died in the gas chamber at Birkenau
  - Maximillian, a Polish priest who substituted himself for the father of a family at Auschwitz
- All those who died during World War II's bombing of civilians by Axis and Allied forces.

Through the Lord and Mary, let us be thankful and more hopeful.

Through the horrific killings of civilians in war, let us pray,

"No more!"

God knows that committing to a **Stewardship** lifestyle is difficult. However, we were not designed to do it on our own, we need God's help. Fortunately, God gave us the greatest gift of all, His son, Jesus. Through the gift of the Eucharist, we unite our sacrifice with Jesus' sacrifice to do the will of God, Our Father. We receive the strength and courage to be His missionary disciples.

### THE CHURCH EXISTS TO EVANGELIZE!

So wrote Blessed Pope Paul VI.

As a member of the Church and the Body of Christ it is your duty, also, to help evangelize the world for Jesus. Here is a way you can contribute to the mission of the Church and our parish:

- 1) Become a catechist for Religious Education (RE) classes. We still need a couple of volunteers to have all our age groups covered!
- 2) Share your experience of prayer with the RE students. For just a couple of minutes, tell them about your own prayer practices, why you like to pray in these ways, how you have grown closer to God and what have you received from your prayer life. Help them form their own routines of communication with the Lord. We will hear witnesses at 9:40 a.m., and then attend Mass.
- 3) Become a catechist with Children's Liturgy of the Word. Leading this part of the Mass for our younger parishioners helps them understand the Word of the Lord.
- 4) Share your witness with the Confirmation Group on October 6, at 7 p.m. in Bernadette Hall. Talk for 5 minutes with individual candidates about your own experience of Confirmation – what it has meant for you, how you are aware of the Holy Spirit in your life and how you respond to the promptings and actions of the Spirit in your life, reminiscences of your own preparation and confirmation. Let them see the different ways the Spirit works in our lives and how we can live out our faith.

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

The Fall Festival is coming! September 26, 27, 28. This will be our 70th annual Fall Festival. That is quite a run and warrants celebration! It will take many of us to make it happen!

Over the 70 years the festival has seen changes even as it consistently happened each Fall.

Our most important consistencies have been in leadership, volunteers, innovations, and neighborhood connections. I want to focus on three of these.

First, we have had excellent leadership. At present, our leader is Jason Bledsoe. He is in his 3rd and final year in this role. Jason has brought vision, courage and passion as our leader. His business skills and a willingness to learn have served us well. With Jason are many others – he would be the first to tell you that he does not do this alone!

Second, volunteers are the backbone of our Festival! We get through only because you show up for leadership, planning, preparation, and on the three days of the festival. So many folks have given countless hours in service to this parish effort.

Third, innovations are a hallmark of any festival. Over the 70 years, nothing stayed the same over time. New ways were found to accomplish our goals. The most recent innovations have been

- movement from the front of our property to the back, allowing for greater safety and a sense of togetherness.
- increased live band presence
- added food choices, all prepared on sight.
- the best silent auction on the Eastside
- quilt raffle by In-Stitches.

One innovation last year was a change in amusement rides. Instead, we moved to an amusement rental company. Some were disappointed. Why did we do this?

We could not secure carnival-style rides for our event. Securing a company has been increasingly difficult each year since 2016. It is now impossible. Over the past six years, the number of amusement or "ride" companies has decreased by more than 50%. Multiple reasons have brought this about, none of which were our fault.

What few companies that do exist see our physical footprint as too small to turn a profit, especially at the end of the season.

We have chosen to stay with this model and expand it somewhat so that our youth and children can have a fun time.

For our Fall Festival to be successful, we need everyone's support. Yes, we need you!

First, we need your presence! Come for an evening of fun and friendship, while you meet new parishioners and other guests.

Second, volunteer for at least one volunteer slot. We will need to staff some of the various amusements, food options, booths, poker room, recycling and trash, and others that I am forgetting. You can sit, stand, or walk with the variety of volunteer opportunities.

Third, we need more sponsors to offset our increased costs. Every family knows a business owner or decision maker who could be tapped for a sponsorship. It's a tax write off. They can only say no, but if asked they may say yes.

Fourth, we need to sell raffle tickets! And entice our friends to the Silent Auction.

The Fall Festival is the single largest fundraiser of the parish. It supports all our ministries. Please help us succeed in meeting our budgeted profit goal of \$ 45,000 and continue our mission here on the Eastside!
