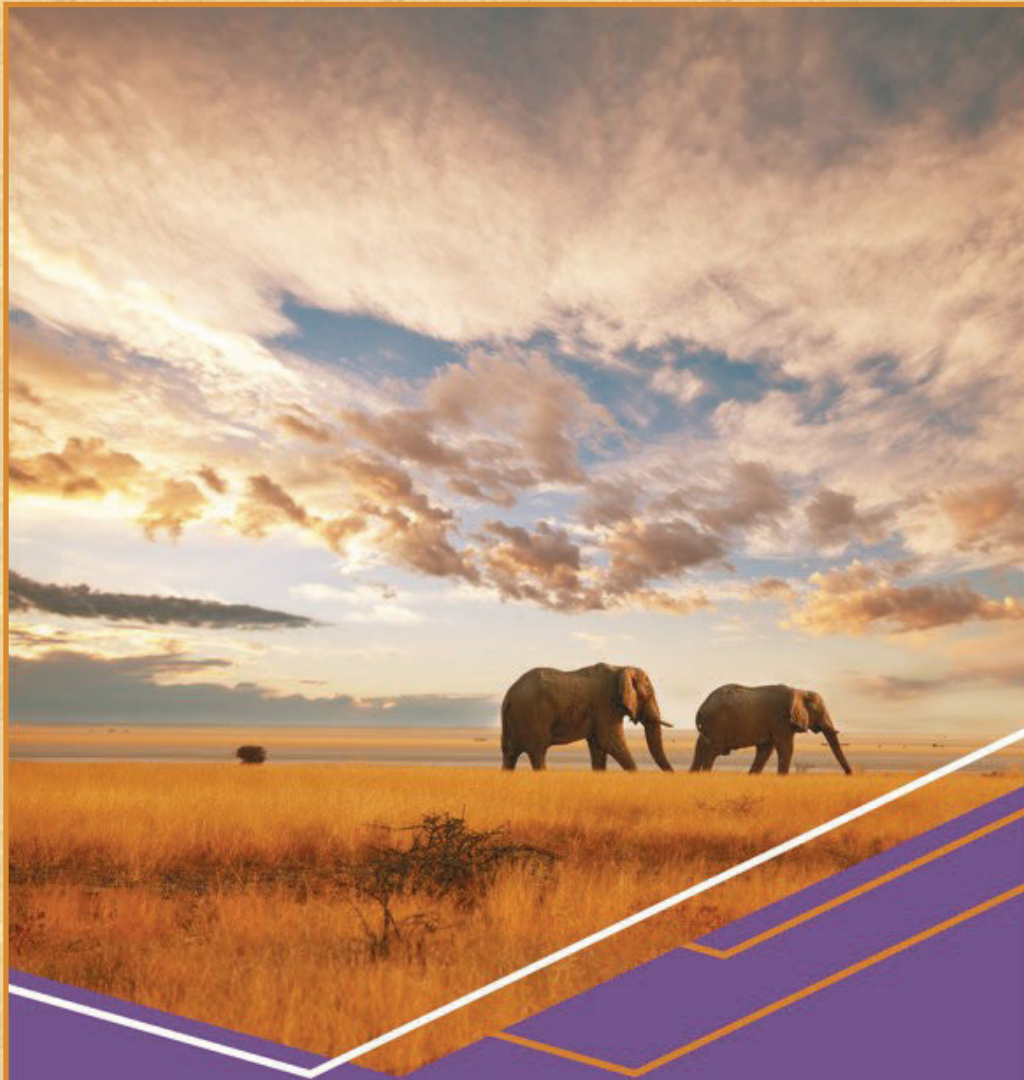

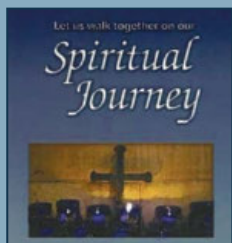

# SCHOOL NEWS

Last year we introduced our school-wide “lifelines” program. In our Catholic School, the best character education has always been taught through our religious studies and modeling Gospel values. In addition to what our school is teaching about our faith, we see value in addressing knowledge, skills, attitudes, and values, that will help students live the faith and to lead healthy and fulfilling lives. As we did last year, this year we will focus on one character trait each month starting in September. We will be referring to the chosen character traits for this school year as our LIFELINES.

A lifeline is defined as a way of getting help or as something on which you depend. It is our hope that our students will better understand that our LIFELINES not only help us to be like Jesus, but we also *depend* on them to be like Him. LIFELINE reminders will be mentioned during daily announcements and are modeled by staff and students. LIFELINES will be incorporated into class lessons and discussions. When a staff member sees a student being a great example of the LIFELINE focus, for the month, he or she will be given a sticker to place on our entryway bulletin board in the space designated for that lifeline. Students who are outstanding examples of the monthly LIFELINE will be recognized after Friday Mass. Your additional support at home would be greatly appreciated.

# The Common Good



In their statement on *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, the Catholic bishops of the United States identify the four main principles of the Church’s social teaching and apply them to some concrete issues. This is not to tell the faithful for whom or against whom to vote, but instead to help them form their consciences in accordance with God’s truth as they approach this often-challenging decision. The four main principles are the Dignity of the Human Person, the Common Good, Solidarity, and Subsidiarity. They are all interrelated. This bulletin focuses on the **Common Good**, and the other three principles are covered in three other bulletins in this series. —★

The Common Good is “the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily.”<sup>1</sup> Human dignity is respected and the common good is fostered only if human rights are protected and basic responsibilities are met. Every human being has a right to life, a right to religious freedom, and a right to have access to those things required for human decency.

Corresponding to these rights are duties and responsibilities—to ourselves, to our families, to the larger society, and to the earth.<sup>2</sup>

In short, we should seek “to build that kind of society where it is easier for people to be good.”<sup>3</sup>

In the midst of a “throwaway world” in which some members of the human family “can be readily sacrificed for the sake of others considered worthy of a carefree existence,” Pope Francis urges us to build a “culture of encounter” in which those most in need receive our greatest concern and attention. We must “place at the center of all political, social and economic activity the human person, who enjoys the highest dignity, and respect for the common good.”<sup>4</sup>

As we seek to imitate the Good Samaritan, who was neighbor to all, we pursue the Common Good in order that every individual and all people can flourish.<sup>5</sup>

- Marriage and the family are the central institutions of social life – the primary

school of virtue, where we first experience common rather than merely individual goods – and so these institutions should be supported and strengthened.

- Likewise, as one human family dwelling in our common home, we must hear “both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor” and respond to climate change with actions to better protect creation for our brothers and sisters now and in generations to come.<sup>6</sup>
- Accepting the entire world as a gift from the Father, and as our common home includes accepting our bodies as God’s gift, whereas thinking that we enjoy absolute power over our own bodies turns, often subtly, into thinking that we enjoy absolute power over creation.<sup>7</sup>
- We recognize and protect the right to religious liberty, our first and most cherished freedom. The protection of conscience and religious liberty is an indispensable element of the common good – a fundamental human right that knows no geographical boundaries.<sup>8</sup>
- While the common good embraces all, those who are weak, vulnerable, and most in need deserve special concern, which the Church describes as the *preferential option for the poor*.<sup>9</sup> Laws and policies must prioritize those who struggle to make ends meet and must preserve the social safety net and promote decent jobs, affordable housing, and childcare.

Pope Benedict XVI writes in *Caritas in Veritate* (*Charity in Truth*): “To desire the common good and strive towards it is a requirement of justice and charity.” We must be attentive to the

common good “juridically, civilly, politically and culturally” in the life of society. “The more we strive to secure a common good corresponding to the real needs of our neighbors,” he writes, “the more effectively we love them.”<sup>10</sup>
