



Pastor's Corner

My dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

A couple of weeks ago, I suggested in the homily that we consider the importance of prayer in our lives.

This week in the Office of Readings (a section of the daily Liturgy of the Hours), the second reading comes from St. Augustine's Letter to Proba. She was a rich widow who had asked Bishop Augustine for instruction and advice concerning prayer in her life.

At one point, he points to a "desire for God, a desire for the happy life (both now and in eternity) with God. He admits of the many distractions and duties which can keep one from prayer. But he insists that if the desire for God and life with God is left unnourished, unattended, the desire will fade.

He encourages her to make time for prayer, whether in short moments or in a lengthier period, insisting that this should be a daily practice. Thus the distractions and duties will find their proper place in the life of the Christian. And the desire for God and life with God will not diminish, but grow and thrive.

In our modern times, distractions and duties abound! Our days are so full with them that life can seem suffocating. And rather than turn to our God in prayerful moments to ease the stress and distress, we turn to other "spirits" – alcohol, entertainments, the internet, games on our electronic devices, etc.

I know a man (not a priest or deacon) who sets an alarm on his phone to remind him to stop and pray. To acknowledge his need for God, to nurture his relationship, to bring to God whatever is present in his day that needs divine assistance, focus, soothing, love. I know that he does so at least 3 times a day.

If you have been on the grounds of Our Lady of Lourdes at noon or 6 p.m. each day, the bells of our church ring, not the hour, but the Angelus. There are three sets of three tollings, followed by the full swing of 1 bell. This bell pattern comes to us from medieval times, when the church bells were rung at 6 a.m., noon, and 6 p.m. in this same pattern. It was a call to prayer morning, noon, and end of day.

Folks would stop what they were doing, turn to toward the church (or the east) and pray the Angelus Prayer. It begins "The angel of the Lord declared unto Mary..." The prayer is a reminder of the Incarnation of Christ.

In keeping with the bells pattern, the prayer consists of three quotes of Scripture (Luke, Luke, and John), each followed by a Hail Mary, concluded by a prayer that begins "Pour forth we beseech thee, O Lord, your grace into our hearts..."

I am wondering if we all could punctuate our days with prayer in a like manner. Perhaps, as St. Augustine urges Proba, our desire for God and life with God would grow, giving a new lens through which to see and live our overly distracted, duty bound and busy lives.

SCHOOL NEWS

If you live in Irvington, you know that the Irvington Halloween tradition is in full "spirit." Last Sunday, our church hosted the community Spooky Organ Concert. The Festival Ball took place in our gymnasium last Saturday. Thursday is Halloween. It would be nearly impossible to ignore Halloween at Our Lady of Lourdes School, a place whose history parallels that of Irvington.

We have not forgotten at Our Lady of Lourdes School that Halloween and Día de los Muertos are rooted in Catholicism. All Hallow's Eve (Halloween) is the beginning of All Saints Day celebrations on November 1, and we continue to remember loved ones on All Souls Day, November 2. The growing popularity of the Mexican traditional sugar skull (calavera) and La Catrina (finely dressed skeleton woman) in North American Halloween culture are reminders to Catholics that death is not to be feared. These festive, colorfully decorated skulls made of sugar and images of La Catrina traditionally adorn graves and ofrendas (family altars). Our intermediate grades will create an ofrenda in remembrance that we will join our loved ones in paradise one day.

While we have a lot of fun with some of the secular Halloween traditions, we remember that there are saints named and unnamed in heaven and souls who have departed our world that we hope to see again. We will be praying for them at Our Lady of Lourdes School.

Students in grades preschool through four are invited to wear costumes to school on Halloween. Older students can dress in Halloween colors or the official Our Lady of Lourdes Halloween gear.
