

Our Lady of Lourdes offers preschool and kindergarten through 8th grade classes. Please call the School Office for more information at 317-357-3316.



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

It's good to be back among you! Thank you so much for your prayers, notes and good wishes for a good recovery and rehabilitation. The latter will take a good while, but I am committed to do what the Doctor and the PT tells me to do; otherwise, my nearly sainted sister Mary will roar as "Nurse Ratchet"!

During my post-op recovery, I have had some time to reflect. One source of the reflection has been the concluding prayers from the Liturgy of the Hours, specifically, at the end of the Office of Readings and Morning Prayer.

The Roman Rite is known for its short collects. The term used in liturgical circles is "sober." They praise God, entreat God, make a statement about God's favor. And then they say something about our response.

Here are two examples of such prayers.

Father, may everything we do begin with your inspiration and continue with your saving help. Let our work always find its origin in you and through you reach completion. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

– Amen.

In the case of this prayer, the source of inspiration for what we do is God; our ability to accomplish what has been inspired is God.

> Attend to the pleas of your people with heavenly care, O Lord, we pray, that they may see what must be done and gain strength to do what they have seen. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

> > — Amen.

In this case, God is asked to hear our pleas that we might know what we are to do and to be strengthened to do it.

In both prayers, the parallels, though brief, are powerful. Their simplicity allows us to ponder what we have heard / read. Our pondering can lead to remembered simple phrases that we can repeat throughout the day as a prayerful touchstone.

I encourage everyone to try this form of reflection based in the liturgical prayers of the Church.


