



Pastor's Corner

My dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

Yesterday, February 22, the Church celebrated the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter. What?!? We celebrate a chair?

Well, the Chair of St. Peter ("cathedra" – throne, or chair, in Latin) was purported to be the very chair that St. Peter used as the first bishop of Rome. Examination of the chair has made it scientifically clear that the oldest parts of the chair are from the 6^{th} Century.

This is not to debunk the significance of the symbolism of the chair – the teaching authority associated with the role of the Bishop of Rome, that is, the Pope. This chair reminds Catholics of the durable truths passed down century by century in the teachings of the Church, especially dogma and doctrine. The Scriptures and their proper interpretation are also a part of the sweep of teaching authority. In addition, the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the Code of Canon Law (both Roman and the Eastern Churches in communion with Rome), and the Liturgical Law contained in the many liturgical books used to celebrate the Mass, Sacraments, consecrations, blessings, etc. are all underpinned by this teaching authority.

Symbols are very important in life. The Chair of Peter is one such important reminder of the Church's role in the salvation of souls.
