

Our Lady of Lourdes offers preschool and kindergarten through 8th grade classes. Please call the School Office for more information at 317-357-3316.



Pastor's Corner

My dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

This weekend, the Third Sunday of Lent, we begin the three-week OCIA ritual known as "The Scrutinies." The new Order of Christian Initiation of Adults describes their purpose and meaning.

"The 'Scrutinies,' which are celebrated solemnly on [three] Sundays [in Lent], have the double purpose to reveal what is weak, sick and sinful in the hearts of the elect so that it can be healed; and what is honorable, strong and holy so that it can be strengthened.

"The purpose of the Scrutinies is mainly spiritual. For the Scrutinies are ordered toward liberation from sin and the Devil, and they give strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life of the elect.

"Moreover, the Scrutinies are set forth to purify minds and hearts, to fortify against temptations, to convert intention, and to awaken the will, so that the elect may cling more closely to Christ and pursue more vigorously their desire to love God." [#141]

Aidan Kavanagh, a monk of St. Meinrad Archabbey, once wrote of the Scrutinies:

"The scrutinies presume that an elected catechumen has reached a further maturity of personal conversion: They begin to make that conversion the public property of the community, as the catechumen approaches the sacraments of initiation at Easter. The church claims that conversion as its own and gives itself to the catechumen in return.'

May we do as Aidan Kavanagh suggests: claim our elect and give ourselves in prayer for them these three weeks.

SCHOOL NEWS



Teacher Feature: Alia Garcia

Middle schoolers line up outside the classroom door, single file, along the green marbloc wall with expressions that reflect one of the following: anxiety, eager anticipation, the will to disappear into the wall, or some mix of several of these emotions. So begins each middle school Spanish class.

Mrs. Alía Garcia Martín, a native of Spain, greets each student with a question chosen to match the student's ability to answer in Spanish. One frequently asked question is, "¿Cuántos años tienes?" To which the adept student will answer, "Tengo doce años." This allows passage into the classroom.

Once the class is assembled, there is not a single dull moment until 45 minutes later when students exit. Señora Garcia's classroom is lively with animated Spanish conversation, singing, activities that require movement with vocabulary, tidbits about Latino cultures, and teasing encouragement of well-pronounced Spanish responses from students.

In her life away from school, Señora Garcia is a devoted wife to husband Diego Camacho and mother to two daughters. They love to travel back to Spain each year for summer. When school breaks allow, they road trip all over the USA to experience as much of our country as they can. We are blessed to have Alía Garcia among our staff, bringing joy and new cultural experiences to us all!





Potentially, <u>54 lives</u> were saved by your donations!




Religious Education News

THE CHURCH EXISTS TO EVANGELIZE! So wrote Blessed Pope Paul IV. As a member of the Church and the Body of Christ it is your duty to help evangelize the world for Jesus. There are many ways you can contribute to the mission of the Church and our parish:

1) Become a catechist for Religious Education (RE) classes. We still need a couple of volunteers to have all our age groups covered!

- 2) Share your experience of prayer with the RE students. For just a couple of minutes, tell them about your own prayer practices, why you like to pray in these ways, how you have grown closer to God and what have you received from your prayer life. Help them form their own routines of communication with the Lord. We will hear witnesses at 9:40 a.m., and then attend Mass.
- CATECHETICAL LEADERS
- 3) Become a catechist with Children's Liturgy of the Word. Leading this part of the Mass for our younger parishioners helps them understand the Word of the Lord.
- 4) Help present topics of discussion or supervise at Confirmation meetings, or on the Confirmation retreat this November.
- 5) Help provide hospitality and community rapport with the OCIA participants, even share your understanding on topics of the faith with them. Sometimes we need a sponsor for someone coming to the faith!



Although we are still working through the spring Scripture study (Women in the New Testament), you may start planning for this year's summer reading. In keeping with the final period of the Eucharistic Revival we will read "Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist, Unlocking the Secrets of the Last Supper." Dr. Brant Pitre of Notre Dame has written a great explanation of the meanings of the Eucharist from its Jewish origin. It is an engaging read, and not an academic tome. We will read the book through the summer and gather to discuss it in early August. Get your copy and get started when you can!

I have a sweet tooth, and a morning routine which is built to support it! But during this Lenten season I am doing without these comforts. The money I save by not spending on my self-gratification I will give in alms – to CRS Rice Bowl! What might you be able to sacrifice for 40 days to give to help another? 25% of all donations stay in the diocese to help our brothers and sisters near to home as well.
