



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

The folks who print our bulletin asked us to be way ahead in production due to scheduled maintenance of the printing presses they use. Thus, I am writing this letter on April 26!

I am sure the world knows by the time you read this who is the most recent successor of Peter. May God – Father, Son and Spirit – walk with our new Pope.

Today is the Fourth Sunday of Easter, commonly known as Shepherd Sunday. The designation is derived from the use of John's gospel, chapter 10, being the source for cycles A, B, and C each year.

This year being Cycle C, we hear the virtual conclusion of the discourse "I am the good shepherd."

The early Church had few images of the Lord. Initially, what sustained them were the words of hymns – such as Philippians 2 ("..he emptied himself") and Colossians 1:15-20 ("..he is the image of the invisible God..."".

Soon enough art, especially in the catacombs, began to reveal more tangible representations, the Good Shepherd among the first.

Perhaps this week you and I can look for other art images of the Good Shepherd, ancient or more contemporary. Which one speaks to us? Which one draws us in, leading to reflection upon Christ as the Good Shepherd?
