



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish:

Recently, I have received some questions about the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Since Lent is approaching (March 2, Ash Wednesday), perhaps this is a "teachable moment" for us all about this sacrament of healing. My format will be Q & A.

"How often should I celebrate this sacrament?" The Church has taught for centuries that we should celebrate this sacrament at least once a year "...if we are in the state of serious / mortal sin."

"Is that as often that I 'should' receive?" That is the only *should* moment. And it does imply that we are NOT to receive the Eucharist if we are in such a state of sin. If we are going to receive the Eucharist, then we "should" avail ourselves (if possible) beforehand. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) says it this way:

1457 According to the precept of the Church, "every believer, having reached the age of discretion, is bound to the obligation to faithfully confess his own grave sins, at least once a year." He who is aware that he has committed a mortal sin must not receive Holy Communion, even if he feels great contrition, without first having received sacramental absolution, unless he has a grave reason for receiving Communion and it is not possible for him to access a confessor.

"If I do not have mortal or serious sin, then I do not have to celebrate the sacrament?" If that is our question, then we have "minimized" the sacrament. True, our lesser (venial) sins are forgiven in many ways – during the Penitential Rite at Mass, the reception of Eucharist, and by our sincere asking for such forgiveness. But the Church urges us to be more than "minimalist"

1458 Although not strictly necessary, the confession of daily sins (venial sins) is nevertheless strongly recommended by the Church. In fact, the regular confession of venial sins helps us to form our conscience, to fight against bad inclinations, to allow ourselves to be healed by Christ, to progress in the life of the Spirit. By receiving more frequently, through this sacrament, the gift of the Father's mercy, we are moved to be merciful like him.

"Do I have to enumerate each sin by number and kind?" Such specificity is only required for mortal / grave sins. The Code of Canon Law states:

Can. 988 §1. A member of the Christian faithful is obliged to confess in kind and number all grave sins committed after baptism and not yet remitted directly through the keys of the Church nor acknowledged in individual confession, of which the person has knowledge after diligent examination of conscience.

Presumably, such grave sins are few in number and easily recalled. (This presumption may not be true if one has been away from the sacrament for many years. The confessor is called upon, in this case, to assist the penitent to do their best in recalling their sins).

Neither the CCC nor the Code requires the penitent's enumeration of number and kind when confessing venial sins. It could be a pious practice for some. But since our lesser (venial) sins are more frequent, this may be impossible. Additionally, in the struggle to "recall" number and kind, the healing power of this sacrament may be obscured while trying to fulfill the impossible.

In the next week or so, I will continue this discussion. For now, may God's mercy be a welcome remedy for our lives!
