

Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



Pastor's Corner

My dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish:

Last week in my series on the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Penance, Confession), we covered the first three steps in the process of celebrating this sacrament.

As we continue this week, you might recall that there is a marked reluctance of many Catholics to enter into the joy of this sacrament of healing. I hope you have been reflecting on your possible reluctance and are benefitting from this series. Now, to the final steps of the process.

Fourth: Receive a penance: The priest will propose an act of penance. The penance might be prayer (e.g., a psalm, a prayer for conversion, etc.), a work of mercy, or an act of charity.

Note that he proposes – for he needs us to embrace the proposed penance and accept it as our own.

If he has not already done so, he might also counsel you on how to live better a Christian life. This most likely will be based on what you have revealed in your confessing.

Fifth: Receive absolution: The priest extends his hands over your head and pronounces the words of absolution. This prayer is quite powerful.

God, the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, (+) and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

This wonderful prayer speaks so succinctly of the healing gift of God through Jesus' sacrificial love. It makes clear that what is taking place at this moment is connected intrinsically to the Church's commissioning by Jesus to be the minister of saving forgiveness. The words "...give you pardon and peace" are spoken by the Church and the minister as the hoped for effect of the sacrament. Finally, the one who has listened, counseled and weighed the words spoken speaks the absolution.

Our sole response is "Amen." So be it, voicing the full reception of the gift. Sixth: Praise and Thanks: The priest will usually praise the mercy of God and will invite you to do the same. For example, the priest may say, "Give thanks to the Lord for he is good." And your response would be, "His mercy endures forever" (Rite of Penance, #47). The priest will then conclude the sacrament, often saying, "Go in peace."

Next week, I will turn to the Penitential Psalms as a means for reflection. They can be used effectively in preparation for celebration of this sacrament of healing.

SCHOOL NEWS

Dear OLL Families,

Lent began this week on Ash Wednesday and we celebrated with an all school Mass. We look forward to the days ahead of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We have many activities and prayers planned for our students in the weeks ahead. These include the Stations of the Cross after every Friday school Mass. Our students will also support Operation Rice Bowl through a penny war. We created a Lenten promise chain, made from each student's personal Lenten goal written on purple paper. You can see the chain on display near the main entrance of the school. We will continue to announce and encourage daily acts of kindness on the morning announcements. Of course, we will also have our Living Stations of the Cross on Good Friday.

Can you believe that we are already approaching the 4th Quarter of the school year? Next Friday, March 11, is the end of the 3rd Quarter of the school year. Please login to Jupiter and check the status of your child's grades. You may find there are missing assignments or make-up work opportunities that you could help your child identify before it's too late. Also, we will have Parent/Teacher Conferences on April 7, so when the time comes, please be sure to sign up for a time to speak with your child's teacher. These conferences allow you to discuss your child's level of readiness for the next grade level and discuss any remaining concerns or celebrations for the current school year.

If you have any questions about financial aid opportunities for the coming school year, please feel free to contact me or Mrs. Bakemeyer, our Business Manager. Last year, the school choice voucher program was vastly expanded, allowing many more families to qualify. Families need to make sure they qualify based on household income and have a pathway to a voucher. Families who meet income qualifications but do not have a pathway should apply for a tax credit scholarship (SGO). We also have financial aid opportunities budgeted through the school, which can be applied for through FACTS.

Good luck to our 3rd grade students next week as they take the IREAD. This state standardized assessment is the first of our students' academic careers. The IREAD measures student reading levels by testing phonics, vocabulary, and comprehension. Grade levels 3-8 will be taking the ILEARN this spring, with the testing window opening later in April. The ILEARN is the assessment that replaced the ISTEP. It measures state standard mastery levels in Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies.

Finally, our Middle School students have been working hard on their National History Day projects for several weeks under the guidance of Mr. Bindewald. Families were able to check out the projects in the cafeteria on Thursday after school. The students did a great job and learned so much about their topics.

Prayers for all of you, as we continue on our Lenten journey together.
