Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

Octaves have been a part of the Roman Liturgical Calendar for centuries. Annually, we celebrate the Octave of Christmas, Mary, Mother of God (January 1). Here at Our Lady of Lourdes we have our own particular octave, our annual Festival of Prayer: February 11-18.

Today we are celebrating the Octave of Easter on this the 2nd Sunday of Easter. We hear each year from the Gospel of John, Chapter 20:19-31. We more commonly note this passage as "Doubting Thomas."

In the early part of this resurrection account, Jesus breathes on the apostles and grants them the power to bind and loose sins. One can call this the "Institution of the Sacrament of Penance / Reconciliation."

There is another name for the end of the Octave: Sunday of Divine Mercy. Saint Pope John Paul II pronounced this new name on April 30, 2000. This was the day of the canonization of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska. This feast was extended to the entire Catholic Church by Pope John Paul II on April 30, 2000, the day that he canonized Saint Faustina.

Born 25, August 1905, in Glogowiec, Poland, Faustina professed her first religious vows in the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in 1928. Until her death on October 5, 1938, she reported having visions of Jesus and conversations with him. She noted these in her diary.

On 22, February 1931, Faustina had a vision of Jesus who presented himself as the "King of Divine Mercy." Wearing a white garment with red and pale rays coming from his heart, she heard him ask her to become the apostle and secretary of divine mercy, a model of how to be merciful to others, and an instrument for emphasizing God's plan of mercy for the world.

By the time of her canonization, a devotion known as the Divine Mercy Chaplet was created. The image of Divine Mercy became rather popular, in some ways rivaling the images of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Prior to Lent and throughout that season, the bulletin letter focused upon the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Perhaps the praying of the Divine Mercy Chaplet will continue to connect us and encourage us to rely upon God's mercy – and be, as Saint Faustina, "apostles" (ones who are sent) of mercy.

Knights of Columbus


Fatima Event Center Located at 1040 North Post Road

SCHOOL NEWS

Dear OLL Families,

Happy Easter to you and your families! I hope that it was a joyous time. If you were able to attend the Living Stations of the Cross on Good Friday, thank you, and we hope you enjoyed the prayer service. Our students did a great job.

Will we see you at the Spring Benefit this Saturday, April 23, at 6 p.m.? It is not too late for you to purchase tickets. This is our school's largest fundraiser. Tuition alone does not cover the costs of a Catholic School education, so fundraisers like this are important to our operation budget, teacher pay, and other programs. Your generosity is greatly appreciated. The evening will feature a catered dinner, drinks, silent auction, and the presentation of the Living Legacy Award to Vic and Bernice Berlage for their contributions to the parish and school over the years. Additionally, scouting leaders of the past and present will be our guests of honor. Please join us for this evening of celebration.

We have a Spring Band Concert for 5th-8th grade this week on Wednesday, April 27, at 6:30 p.m. in the school gym. Mr. Conroy and the students have been working very hard for months to prepare this program and we look forward to the evening of music. Parents, if your child has a conflict with a sports game or practice, we ask that you please place priority on the Spring Concert. This has been on our school calendar all year and only happens on this one evening. Your children will have many other athletic games and practices.

The ILEARN assessment began this week at OLL. Our students had been working hard in preparation and are off to a good start. As a reminder the ILEARN is the assessment that replaced ISTEP in 2019. It is a state standardized test for all students in grades 3-8. Parents, please make sure your children get a good night's sleep during the ILEARN testing window (the next two weeks) and feed them a nutritious breakfast. Also, it is important that students arrive to school on time during the testing window and that no appointments are scheduled during test times in the morning. Finally, encourage your child to do his/her very best on the ILEARN and approach the assessment with a positive attitude. We look forward to great results.

Our 8th grade students look forward to celebrating **Confirmation** this Thursday evening, April 28, at the Cathedral downtown with the Archbishop, Father Rick, and Deacon Tom. Also, 1st Communion for 2nd graders will take place on Saturday, May 14, during the 5 p.m. Mass. Both groups of students have been preparing for several months under the direction of their catechists, and we support them as they receive these important sacraments as the next step in their spiritual journeys.

If you have questions about your eligibility for financial aid, please contact the school office. Remember, the school offers financial aid in 3 ways—through FACTS, tax credit scholarships (SGO), and school choice vouchers. If you are waiting to complete your school choice (voucher) application, we will communicate more instructions in the near future. Amanda Bakemeyer, the parish Business Manager, has accepted an offer from Cathedral High School, and we are working on a transition plan as the parish searches for a new Business Manager.
