

Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish:


The Fourth Sunday of Easter is "Good Shepherd Sunday" in our liturgical calendar. It gets the name from Chapter 10 of the Gospel of John, portions of which are the gospel reading for Cycles A, B and C.

This year's particular passage is the shortest, a mere 4 verses. But they are packed with meaning! "My sheep hear my voice... they follow me... I give them eternal life... No one can take them out of my hand."

Once again the gospel writer known for long discourses and high theology uses the most intimate of images to describe the Lord's relationship to his own! I marvel that such a learned crafter of language and thought can be so expressive of human images.

"No one can take them out of my hand." A firm grasp, for sure. A possessiveness shot through with faithful love. A human friend speaking for God, whom he calls Father. With whom he is one. Thus, the Father himself through the Son holds the sheep, the beloved!

Brothers and sisters, it is ours to listen, ours to follow. We need not concern ourselves with the faithfulness of the one who shepherds. We only need fulfill the part we have been given in this eternal relationship. We are so graced, so blessed.
