

Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



# Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

Today we begin a full four weeks of Advent. Yes, four whole weeks! This occurs every year when Christmas Day falls on Sunday.

Here's to "waiting in joyful hope!" For what shall we wait?

Will we wait at all?

Liturgically, our waiting is preparatory. Each day's readings – at Mass and in the Liturgy of the Hours -- direct our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time **and** to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. "Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36)." (USCCB)

What might be missed in the "two comings of Christ" so described and anticipated is the "third coming of Christ." This third coming is more imminent and intimate. Our waiting allows Christ to come into our hearts.

The coming of Christ in the Incarnation we celebrate annually. The coming of Christ at the end of time we anticipate, "waiting in joyful hope." But the coming of Christ into our hearts is an everyday possibility. Advent gives us a unique time to welcome with joy the Savior -- his reality, his promises, his many gifts with which he graces us.

How shall we wait? That is up to each one of us! Carving out some time for daily reflection through our Advent/Christmas resource booklet is a start. Reading the daily readings and spending time with them is another (they are readily available at **www.usccb.org**, and are connected directly to the Revised New American Bible for context and greater understanding through commentary and footnotes). Or just sitting in a quiet place, with a candle piercing the darkness, inviting us to the safety of Christ's presence.

I hope that we will each wait well this Advent. We have plenty of time – four whole weeks!

One final note. Those four candles we see on the Advent Wreath in church – traditionally they mark the weeks. In addition, they invite us to:

Hope – First Week

Love – Second Week

Joy - Third Week

# Pray the Rosary for Life

Pope John Paul II has given us two great gifts: the Mysteries of Light as part of the Holy Rosary, and the Gospel of Life in his great encyclical, *Evangelium Vitae*. The following meditations on the Mysteries of Light are offered as a prayer for all life, from conception to natural death.



1st Mystery of Light Baptism in the Jordan

Prayer intention: That all baptized Christians will be open to the Holy Spirit and bear witness to the sanctity of life.

2nd Mystery of Light The Wedding Feast at Cana

Prayer intention: For all husbands and wives, that they treasure the priceless gift of married love by generously accepting children through procreation and adoption.

3rd Mystery of Light Proclamation of the Kingdom of God

Prayer intention: That those who pray and work for greater respect for human life will be guided by the Beatitudes and reveal the face of

Christ to others.

4th Mystery of Light The Transfiguration

Prayer intention: That our world will be transfigured by the witness of faithful Christians so that all may understand the priceless value

of every human being.

5th Mystery of Light Institution of the Eucharist

Prayer intention: That through our worthy reception of the Eucharist and frequent Eucharistic Adoration, Jesus will teach us to love sacrificially the least and needlest among us.
