Communion Calls: Please call the parish office to arrange Communion calls for the home-bound.



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

We begin Week 2 of our Advent Season today. Our focus continues to be "waiting in joyful hope!" That hope will be fired and made stronger as we take the time to allow Christ, the One who is, who was, and is to come, into our hearts.

St. Charles Borromeo wrote a pastoral letter about Advent in the 16th Century. Part of that letter follows here.

"In her concern for our salvation, our loving mother the Church uses this holy season to teach us through hymns, canticles and other forms of expression, of voice or ritual, used by the Holy Spirit. She shows us how grateful we should be for so great a blessing, and how to gain its benefit: our hearts should be as much prepared for the coming of Christ as if he were still to come into this world. The same lesson is given us for our imitation by the words and example of the holy men of the Old Testament."

The Advent hymns we sing each week are truly treasures for our hearts. For the next three weeks, I will be sharing the lyrics of one of those hymns. Food for our hearts, so to speak.

On Jordan's bank the Baptist's cry Announces that the Lord is nigh; Awake and hearken for he brings Glad tidings of the king of kings.

Then cleansed be ev'ry life from sin; Make straight the way of God within And let each heart prepare a home Where such a mighty guest may come.

For you are our salvation, Lord, Our refuge and our great reward; Without your grace we waste away Like flow'rs that wither and decay.

To heal the sick stretch out your hand, And bid the fallen sinner stand; Shine forth and let your light restore Earth's own true loveliness once more.

All praise to you eternal son, Whose advent has our freedom won, Whom with the Father we adore, And Holy Spirit, ever more.

One of the early church writers, St. Gregory of Nazianzen, also wrote something of note for this Second Sunday of Advent. It is not a hymn, but surely it speaks to our hearts.

"Christ, the light of all lights, follows John, the lamp that goes before him. The Word of God follows the voice in the wilderness; the bridegroom follows the bridegroom's friend, who prepares a worthy people for the Lord by cleansing them by water in preparation for the Spirit."

Ah, may it be so!
