

Marriage: Please contact the pastor at least six months in advance. No wedding dates will be set until a couple has met with the pastor. Communion Calls: Please call the



### Pastor's Corner

My dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

Happy New Year! May the unfolding of this year bring blessings, changes to our lives as needed, and strength to face whatever challenges lie ahead!

Today we are celebrating Mary, Mother of God. The Greek word for this is Theotokos, that is, God bearer. We actually make note of this throughout the year from March 25 (Annunciation), May 31 (Visitation), and June 25 (the Birth of John the Baptist).

Mary's acceptance of the angel's invitation is the first step of the biblical unfolding of Mary as Mother of God. As we celebrate this day of her motherhood, let us recall that first step.

Below is a reflection by St. Bernard of Clairvaux upon this moment. The Liturgy of the Hours names it: The whole world awaits Mary's reply.

"You have heard, O Virgin, that you will conceive and bear a son; you have heard that it will not be by man but by the Holy Spirit. The angel awaits an answer; it is time for him to return to God who sent him. We too are waiting, O Lady, for your word of compassion; the sentence of condemnation weighs heavily upon us.

"The price of our salvation is offered to you. We shall be set free at once if you consent. In the eternal Word of God we all came to be, and behold, we die. In your brief response we are to be remade in order to be recalled to life.

"Tearful Adam with his sorrowing family begs this of you, O loving Virgin, in their exile from Paradise. Abraham begs it, David begs it. All the other holy patriarchs, your ancestors, ask it of you, as they dwell in the country of the shadow of death. This is what the whole earth waits for, prostrate at your feet. It is right in doing so, for on your word depends comfort for the wretched, ransom for the captive, freedom for the condemned, indeed, salvation for all the sons of Adam, the whole of your race.

"Answer quickly, O Virgin. Reply in haste to the angel, or rather through the angel to the Lord. Answer with a word, receive the Word of God. Speak your own word, conceive the divine Word. Breathe a passing word, embrace the eternal Word.

"Why do you delay, why are you afraid? Believe, give praise, and receive. Let humility be bold, let modesty be confident. This is no time for virginal simplicity to forget prudence. In this matter alone, O prudent Virgin, do not fear to be presumptuous. Though modest silence is pleasing, dutiful speech is now more necessary. Open your heart to faith. O blessed Virgin, your lips to praise, your womb to the Creator. See, the desired of all nations is at your door, knocking to enter. If he should pass by because of your delay, in sorrow you would begin to seek him afresh, the One whom your soul loves. Arise, hasten, open. Arise in faith, hasten in devotion, open in praise and thanksgiving. Behold the handmaid of the Lord, she says, be it done to me according to your word.'

Thus God's plan begins to unfold. Whatever Mary's youthful plan may have been, her prudent openness, pondering, being deeply troubled, listening, questioning, receiving the angelic response – finally accepting – was the greatest journey to "yes" ever told.

The Gospels do not tell us why or how she was so disposed to the angelic visitation. One would assume she was prayerfully connected to God in the Covenant of Moses and its observance. One would assume she grew up in a household that encouraged such connection to God.

Perhaps our calling as this New Year commences is to ponder in our hearts the call of God. Raise our questions, listen for response, and after our yes, continue to ponder in our hearts the events in our life that continue to invite a seeking of God and the blessing God's purpose and presence.
