



Pastor's Corner

My dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

Our Christmas Season ends for most of us this weekend. The actual ending is Monday, January 9, 2023 – the Baptism of the Lord. But we won't be here in church together.

As we step from this bright season to Ordinary Time, let me share two things: Epiphany, and Bethlehem Peace Light prayer today.

Epiphany: Peter Chrysologus, a saint of the 5th Century, wrote the following for Epiphany. I hope you find it inspires you!

"In choosing to be born for us, God chose be known by us. He therefore reveals himself in this way, in order that this great sacrament of his love may not be an occasion for us of great misunderstanding.

"Today the magi find, crying in a manger, the one they have followed as he shone in the sky. Today the magi see clearly, in swaddling clothes, the one they have long awaited as he lay hidden among the stars.

Today, the magi gaze in deep wonder at what they see: heaven on earth, earth in heaven, humanity in God, God in humanity, one whom the whole universe cannot contain now enclosed in a tiny body. As they look, they believe and do not question as their symbolic gifts bear witness: incense for God, gold for a king, myrrh for one who is to die..."


Bethlehem Peace Light: As our celebration of the revelation of God in Christ to all peoples (Epiphany) comes to a close, in all truth it will not close this day in the normal way.

A large host consecrated at our celebration will be placed in the monstrance for Exposition and Adoration. For 5 hours, we will have time to rejoice in God's revelation to the nations in Christ. For 5 hours, we will have time to pray to the Prince of Peace, born in Bethlehem as the source of eternal light.

Our time in prayer is broken into $\frac{1}{2}$ hour segments. Please remain here in the church after Mass, if you choose, for a time. Or return after brunch, your afternoon nap, or an NFL game, to pray for peace in our world, but especially in Ukraine.

At 4 p.m. we will conclude this time with Evening Prayer (Vespers) and Benediction.


