

Our Lady of Lourdes offers preschool and kindergarten through 8th grade classes. Please call the School Office for more information at **317-357-3316**.



Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

The person of faith who wrote Psalm 36 expressed in very few words reliance upon God.

In you is the source of life
and in your light we see light.

Monday afternoon, May 16, Msgr. (Father) Paul Koetter entered into eternal life. He encountered the source of all life, the light to which we return in death.

There are many things that could be said about this holy, humble pastor and leader who relied upon God. Already words, memories and photos have sprouted on Facebook; more will spring up in the Criterion. And still more will be said at the visitation, vigil, funeral Mass and burial (details will be published, I hope, in the Friday Newsletter of May 20).

Ironically, May 20, would have been Father Paul's 45th anniversary of ordination. From that moment until his death, he lived a life of service for so many.

Father Paul was a mentor, a spiritual director, an excellent listener, and a man of keen insights at meetings.

I knew him as a delightful brother priest, a tease who poked fun while receiving poke back (when I called him "Monsignor" he always retorted "Richard"). He delighted in the banter shared, yet was keenly alert to his brother priests needs and tolerant of our faults.

He was also a man who missed details. For example, he and I resided at the rectory of SS. Peter and Paul. He would return to his second floor room (adjacent to mine) and slam his door. He was oblivious to this habit, even when gently confronted:

"Paul, do you know you slam your door?" His smiling response: "No, I don't," moved from a puzzled repost which ultimately gave way to "Oh, I guess I do, once in a while."


In another such moment his adult faith sharing group gathered in the main parlor on the first floor. On that occasion, a member of the group (whom we both knew from our days at Little Flower -- he, 1982-1983; I, 1983-1985), pointed out that I had shaved my mustache. Father Paul exclaimed: "No, he didn't". His friend persisted in her observation, he in his "no" -- until I came down the stairs to show him the bare upper lip. What a sight it was as, with gap-toothed smile, he accepted with chagrin that truly I was facially shorn!

Father Paul led our deanery from 2009 until his retirement in 2020. He oversaw, with representatives of all the deanery parishes, the Connected in the Spirit discernment process. He championed our Eastside Catholic Cohort, helping us to imagine ourselves in new ways. He was an effective leader among leaders of our Eastside Catholic Schools Partnership. He was a brother to the priests of our Deanery.

There is a hole in many hearts right now as we let go of Father Paul, Monsignor to a few, always "Father" to most. I have missed him, and will continue to do so.

By the grace of God, may he rest in peace.

Dear OLL Families,

Congratulations to our 8th graders who, with the help of several 6th graders, performed the play *Mayor Gone Missing* on the stage last weekend. This play was written by two of our 8th grade students, Natalee Darzentas and Maeve Waninger. We are the only school I know of where students wrote the play! All of our actors did a wonderful job, and we are thankful to Mr. Conroy for dedicating his time to direct.

Our teachers and staff are doing their best to keep the students on task and wrap up the year in a productive and positive way. Our NWEA testing concluded this week, and we look forward to analyzing our results, especially as they relate to growth. Next week, you will receive an NWEA progress report that will summarize your child's growth and how his/her scores compare to the national norm (percentile) and the local district average.


