



Pastor's Corner

My dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes parish,

This past Tuesday, Deacon Tom gave a reflection on Jeremiah 20:7-11 at the Holy Hour for Vocations. I was captivated by what he said, in part because Jeremiah 20 was a key text through which I discerned my vocation to ordained ministry. The text can be found on the web at https://bible.usccb.org/bible/jeremiah/20

Here is Deacon Tom's reflection. It is worthy of consideration, musing, reflection.

"In this passage, we experience the conflict of the prophet Jeremiah. In fact, should you look up this passage in your bible you will see that this passage is subtitled: "Jeremiah's Interior Crisis." In it, Jeremiah accuses God of seducing him into accepting a mission that was only going to bring him hardship, alienation, loneliness and pain.

"Jeremiah contemplates abandoning the role that God has called him to, but ultimately admits that he knows that God is with him and that, together, they will conquer their foes.

"Jeremiah's example offers a side of vocations that we seldom talk about. We tend to focus on the need for young people to hear and respond to God's call. And while we pray for the ordained, the religious, and those in discernment, I worry that we sometimes fail to appreciate the pressures placed on those discerning or living out their vocations.

"Several years ago, I asked a priest friend and mentor of mine: 'Why don't you tell people, especially young people, how happy you are to be a priest?' He responded that it was very difficult being a priest and especially difficult to be proud of his vocation. You see, I asked the question during the height of the priestly pedophile scandal. My mentor felt that every time he appeared in public that someone was judging him; that he was guilty by association.

"I'm sure that stigma, and other negative stereotypes about religious people, still linger on today. In my own experience, I have been asked more times than I can count: 'How can you work for and represent that messed up church'.

"When one of our young people, be it high school or college, shares that they are considering the religious life, they are much more likely to hear questioning, criticism or silence than they are encouragement. Their peers are much more likely to assume that something is wrong with them, than they are to support their call. And it's not just their friends. Parents, relatives and even strangers are likely to challenge the young person or remain silent.

"Jeremiah felt abandoned and alone. He survived his interior crisis by trusting foremost in God and I suspect most of our next generation of religious will need to do the same. However, we have the opportunity to support, encourage and celebrate our current and future religious. Let's pray that we will recognize and seize opportunities to do so."

We Are Called to Serve

When I was ill you cared for me. What you did for the least of these you did for me. (Matthew 25:35)

Throughout Scripture, Jesus calls us to serve. He commands us to feed the hungry, cloth the naked, provide shelter to the homeless and visit the sick. How do you answer Jesus' call to serve? - On any given day there are more than one hundred Catholic patients at IU, Riley and Methodist Hospitals. It is our Catholic tradition to provide daily Holy Communion and fellowship to our hospitalized brothers and sisters. Many of these Catholics have been away from the Church for years. Their hospital stay may well be their only contact with the Church. Like you and me these people will one day come face to face with their God. We have the opportunity to influence each patient in some way and possibly have an effect on their eternal soul. There is currently an urgent need for volunteers to bring the Eucharist to these patients. - I invite you to prayerfully consider this call to serve. You need not be a current Eucharistic Minister in your parish as volunteers are trained for the hospital and then commissioned. Training is provided by the hospital and chaplaincy service. Scheduling is flexible. Volunteers are needed to serve once a week or as occasional substitutes. Normally it takes 2 to 3 hours to visit the patients on any given day. 
