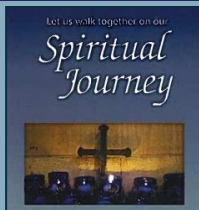

Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

Tuesday, October 18, was the Feast of St. Luke, Evangelist. It is significant this year because the majority of the Sunday gospel passages since First Advent (November 28, 2021) have been from Luke's great first work.

One of the thematic threads in Luke's gospel is prayer. Jesus at prayer. His disciples asking him how to pray. His disciples at prayer with him.

And then there are such passages as last Sunday and this coming Sunday: persistence in prayer, on the one hand; and how to be in prayer before God, on the other.

Deacon Tom did so well in his homily this past weekend. He led us to the value of prayer in our lives, especially prayer that is shared prayer. Let me quote a paragraph from his excellent homily. (*I have divided the one paragraph into a number for ease of reading.*)

"Some of us discount the need for prayer. Some believe that our all-knowing God, who recognizes every star by name, surely knows what lies in the recesses of our hearts and minds, even before we are aware of them. And that is true!

"Therefore, we must conclude that our prayers are not for God's benefit at all. Instead, when we pray, we are the benefactors of that prayer.

"Every time we engage God in prayer, we recognize his supremacy and we grow deeper in relationship with him.

"Each time we pray, we recognize our dependence on God and we recognize that our happiness ultimately rests in him.

"And by engaging him, and being comforted by him, we grow in our love for him.

"Of course, God wants us to pray with persistence. He embraces every opportunity to share his infinite love with us and he welcomes our every encounter as an occasion to grow closer to him."

Deacon Tom's words echo the very words of Saint Ambrose, who wrote:

"So that we might obtain this life of happiness (*eternal life*), he who is true life itself taught us to pray, not in many words as though speaking longer could gain us a hearing. After all, we pray to one who, as the Lord himself tells us, knows what we need before we ask for it.

"Why he should ask us to pray, when he knows what we need before we ask him, may perplex us if we do not realize that our Lord and God does not want to know what we want (for he cannot fail to know it) but wants us rather to exercise our desire through our prayers, so that we may be able to receive what he is preparing to give us. His gift is very great indeed, but our capacity is too small and limited to receive it. That is why we are told: Enlarge your desires, do not bear the yoke with unbelievers.

"The deeper our faith, the stronger our hope, the greater our desire, the larger will be our capacity to receive that gift, which is very great indeed. No eye has seen it; it has no color. No ear has heard it; it has no sound. It has not entered man's heart; man's heart must enter into it."

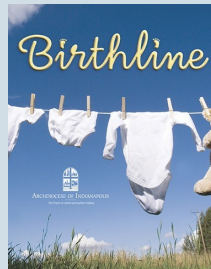
