

## Pastor's Corner

My dear brothers and sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish,

As our Lenten journey begins, or has begun, it is worthwhile to note that all journeys require patient endurance.

The pilgrim journey has a purposeful goal. But that goal is not just the destination; the journey itself is a goal.

As the pilgrim moves moment by moment, day by day, he or she encounters thoughts, questions, ideas, obstacles - physical, mental, spiritual; and perhaps journey companions, strangers who become known through the journey.

Endurance. Patient endurance. This is what sustains the pilgrim. Through Lent, of course. But also through all life's moments.

Just before we began our Lenten pilgrimage (of hope, I pray!), the Office of Readings in the Liturgy of the Hours commenced the Book of Job. In its second chapter, Job becomes physically afflicted. His wife, in stark contrast to the legendary "patience of Job," counsels him to curse God and die.

Job's response is instructive, as Pope Saint Gregory the Great notes in his Moral Commentary on Job.

If we have received good from the hand of the Lord, why should we not endure evil?

"We ought particularly to observe in Job's words, how skillfully he meets his wife's persuading: If we have received good from the hand of the Lord, why should we not endure evil? It is a great comfort in tribulation if, in times of adversity, we recall the gifts our Creator has given us. Nor will overwhelming sorrow break us, if we quickly call to mind the gifts which have sustained us. For it is written: On the day of prosperity do not forget affliction, and on the day of affliction do not forget prosperity.

"For if a man receives God's gifts, but forgets his affliction, he can fall through his own excessive joy.

"On the other hand, when a man is bruised by scourges, but is not at all consoled by the thought of the blessings he has been fortunate to receive, he is completely cast down.

"Thus both attitudes must be united so that one may be supported by the other: the memory of the gift can temper the pain of the affliction, and the foreboding and fear of the affliction can modify the joy of the gift.

"And so the holy Job, to soothe his soul's depression in the midst of his wound, weighs the delightful gifts he has received even while he suffers from the scourges, saying: *If we have received good from the hand of the Lord, why should we not endure evil?*"

Which returns me to the brief newsletter reflection from February 28: rooting our Lenten journey in thanksgiving for the good we have received in life thus far, while we endure the repentant struggle through to the goal of Easter joy.

## SCHOOL NEWS




We have fully entered the State of Indiana testing season.

Our students who are blessed to speak more than one language, with a language other than English being the first learned, have completed WIDA testing. The WIDA measures a student's English academic language skills. This week, our second and third graders began IREAD testing. This assessment is meant to gauge basic reading skills to be mastered by the end of the third grade year. ILEARN testing for grades three through eight will begin the week of April 14, and the testing window will remain open through May 9. This test measures mastery of reading, writing, and math for all listed grades. Science is tested in grades four and six while social studies is tested in grade five.

Schools, administrators, and teachers can feel lots of pressure related to students' performance on these tests. At Our Lady of Lourdes, our policy is that we arrive at school every day with a vision for our students' general academic success in mind. If teachers are passionate about what they do; if students are inspired to learn; and with your support at home encouraging plenty of sleep, eating healthy breakfasts, and making education the priority all school year long, the scores will take care of themselves.


